From the Desk of Cassandra Agredo

Feed the hungry. There it is, in black and white, and in the gospels. Feed the hungry. Not “feed the hungry if we feel like it” or “feed the hungry if it’s convenient for us.” No. It is a simple direction from Christ himself to take care of each other’s most basic human needs for food and water, without which all would die. Very simple, nothing provocative. Feed the hungry.

And yet, day after day, month after month, year after year.....we don’t. “We” collectively as a society... do not. Maybe I personally do and maybe you personally do, but as long as others do not, and as long as we don’t hold them accountable, as long as one and a half million New Yorkers.... fifty million Americans....EIGHT HUNDRED MILLION PEOPLE WORLDWIDE.....suffer from hunger....as long as two and a half million children die from hunger each year....then “we”, together, are failing. We are not feeding the hungry. We are collectively denying our neighbors, our brothers and sisters, our fellow human beings, the right to this most basic of all things. We are essentially saying to them “No. You do not deserve a fighting chance to make the most of this life. You are not worthy of the dignity of human life. No. Not you.”

I have looked into a father’s eyes, filled with tears, as he admits that his kids are hungry and he cannot provide enough food to fill them up. I have hugged a mother, her body limp with exhaustion, no tears left, as she stares at her cart full of food as if Christmas has come early. I have held a child, with deformed limbs and the inability to speak, because from the time of his birth he didn’t have enough nutritious food to eat. My eyes have looked into theirs. I have pressed my skin against their skin. I have felt their hearts beating in time with my own. I say to them “you’re welcome” and “God bless you too” when really what I want to say is “I’m sorry. I am sorry that you will be hungry again tomorrow. I am sorry that we do not value you. I am sorry that your eyes and your skin and your heart are somehow considered less important than mine.”

But it doesn’t have to be this way. We can change. We do not have to fail. Perhaps “we”, this huge global society, is not ready to change all at once. But we at St. Francis Xavier...we are ready. We provide food for those who are hungry but more, importantly, we are ready to stand together with those in need and make our voices heard and elect people who will work for change. And this change will in turn affect our city. And then “we” as New Yorkers....then we will be ready. And New York will change. And when New York sets the example then we, America....we will be ready. And America will change. And when America begins to change, the world will take notice. And then we, humanity, we will finally be ready. Our eyes and our hearts will be opened and we will recognize the dignity and worth of every human being and we will respect the right of each person to food and water and a fighting chance to make the most of our lives. It will be a long, frustrating and bumpy road but we are ready. We will not fail. We will feed the hungry. And one beautiful, amazing, glorious day, hunger will be no more. Thank you for all you have done and continue to do for the Xavier Mission. Have a very happy and blessed Thanksgiving.

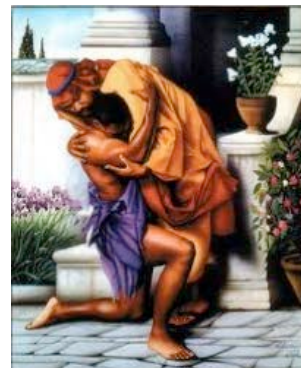

St. Ignatius Loyola said that love is to be shown more in deeds than in words. The Xavier Peace and Justice Committee invite you to join us in our efforts to proclaim the living Gospel, examining root causes of injustice, and advocating for reform. Recent events and advocacy include our co-sponsoring with Xavier Mission, a hunger banquet and film screening to focus attention on food insecurity. We are currently formulating actions for continuing our advocacy for the food insecure. Our water justice group is currently working on several initiatives that will allow Xavier to concretely address water (and waste) issues right at home on 16th street and there is ongoing work on many fronts against modern day slavery. We have sponsored congressional visits to advocate for immigration reform and a fair living wage – among other things- and we are hoping to apply that level of advocacy to city and state representatives and officials as well. Please join us in our efforts to bring justice to these and other important issues. We generally meet 1 time per month from September through May, with sub-committees meeting as needed. We welcome new members!
