A FATHERS DAY MESSAGE

I'm writing this column unexpectedly. I have played several roles in my life: brother, partner, uncle, Godfather, cousin, friend, but the one that I never thought I would inhabit was Dad. As a gay man who is now 65, I am from a generation who presumed if you had come out when you were in your twenties, being a Dad was not a vocation to which you would be called. Well, as they say, the Holy Spirit had other plans.

Five years ago, I met Bill. On our first date he told me that he had a son, Gui, who was 36 and who spent two weekends a month with him. Gui also spent two weekends with his mother, and the rest of the time Gui shared a home for people who are differently abled. Gui has been the light of Bill's life since he was born. Life expectancy for people with Down's syndrome when Gui was born was 14 years. Since then medical advances have increased life expectations to the upper 50's. Last month we celebrated Gui's 42nd birthday.

I fell in love with Bill in part because of the love he has showered on Gui. The patience and devotion that both Bill and Gui's mom have demonstrated have nurtured a wonderful son who is open, optimistic, caring, eager to engage the world, and all it can offer.

I joined not certain what role I could play, but open. By the second time I met Gui, I was welcomed with big hugs. Within a short time, not only had I been fully accepted by Gui, but I was adopted as an integral part of his family. To feel that unconditional, unquestioning love that he radiates, is to have a glimpse of what I think God feels for God's creation.

The gift of my fatherhood has been immeasurable. Having never expected it, I am enraptured by the commitment, trust and dedication it evokes from me. I watch in amazement as the joy and affection that Gui distributes so unconsciously, calls forth the best from those with whom he is in contact. He doles out grace, not as a precious commodity that is to be guarded, but as the abundant gift that he has received. He passes it on with gusto.

Most Sundays when Gui is with us, he joins me for mass. I am thrilled when he comes as the parish has embraced him as fully as he has embraced me. His ability to see good and to find God in everything is truly Ignatian. In his uncomplicated way, he shows me where God is. That is what unexpected fatherhood has taught me: Never say never where the Holy Spirit is concerned, and to always be surprised by joy for that is what fatherhood has brought me.

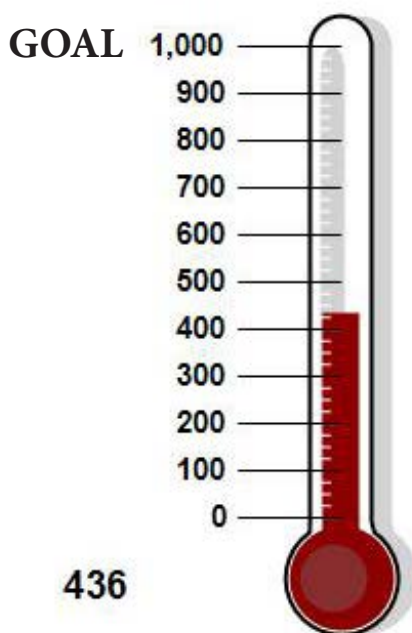


THE XAVIER SHELTER NAMING PROJECT
