SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 13 FIRST DAY OF CLASSES

Family Faith is the religious education program at the Church of St. Francis Xavier serving children from pre-kindergarten through 12th grade. Since religious education is a lifelong process, the program also includes post-confirmation classes.

Members of Family Faith worship together at the 9:00 a.m. Mass on Sunday. After Mass, we gather in the Xavier High School library. After a brief period of (healthy) snacks, announcements and prayer, parents accompany their children to their classrooms. Parents may either stay with their children or return to the library for a guest speaker and discussion. At 11:30, parents pick up their children at their classroom.

Children receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Eucharist if they are at least in 2nd grade and have completed two consecutive years in the program. They receive the sacrament of Confirmation when they are at least in 7th grade and have completed two consecutive years in the program. **For more information, please contact Luz Marina Diaz in the parish office.**

Scripture Readings For the Week

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

2 Kings 4:42-44; Eph 4:1-6; John 6:1-15. *They shall eat and there shall be some left over. One body, one Lord, one faith, one baptism. He distributed as much as they wanted to those who were reclining.*

Seventeenth Monday in Ordinary Time:

Exod 32:15-24, 30-34; Matt 13:31-35. *This people has indeed committed a grave sin, in making a god of gold for themselves. The mustard seed becomes a large bush, and the birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches.*

Seventeenth Tuesday in Ordinary Time:

Exod 33:7-11; 34:5b-9, 28; Matt 13:36-43. *The LORD spoke to Moses face to face. Just as the weeds are gathered now and burned up with fire, so it will be at the end of the age.*

Wednesday~ Feast of St. Martha: Exod 34:29-35; John 11:19-27. *Seeing the face of Moses, they were afraid to come near him. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God.*

Seventeenth Thursday in Ordinary Time:

Exod 40:16-21, 34-38; Matt 13:47-53. *The cloud covered the meeting tent and the glory of the LORD filled the Dwelling. They put what is good into buckets, what is bad they throw away.*

Friday~ Feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola:

Jer 20:7-9; Cor 10:31-11:1; Luke 14:25-33. *It becomes like fire burning in my heart. Do everything for the glory of God. Everyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple.*

Saturday~ Feast of St. Alphonsus Liguori:

Lev 25:1, 8-17; Matt 14:1-12. *In the year of the jubilee you shall return, everyone of you, to your own property. Herod had John beheaded. John's disciples came and told Jesus.*

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time:
