THE CHOIR: This community of 30 – 40 singers meets twice a week. Thursday evening

rehearsal runs from 7-9 and we gather on Sunday morning at 10:30 to lead the congregation in musical worship at the 11:30 liturgy. We also sing for all major Holy Days (Christmas and Easter) and occasionally for a special event. Ability to carry a tune and sing in harmony is required. Ability to read music is an added plus, but is not required. We are looking for members in all categories: soprano, alto, tenor and bass, but are especially in need of altos and basses this year.





THE INSTRUMENTAL GROUP: The group meets on Sundays at 3:45 and prepares for the 5:00 liturgy that day. We also have several extra rehearsals throughout the year for the major holidays (Christmas and Easter). The ability to sight read music moderately well is necessary. Col 1:24-2:3; Luke 6:6-11. *I am a minister of the* Church to bring to completion the mystery hidden from ages past. The scribes and the Pharisees watched him closely to see if he would cure on the sabbath.

Tuesday~ Feast of The Nativity of the **Blessed Virgin Mary:** Mic 5:1-4a; Matt 1:1-16. The time when she who is to give birth has borne. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her.

Wednesday~ Feast of St. Peter Claver: Col 3:1-11; Luke 6:20-26. You have died with Christ; put

to death, then, the parts of you that are earthly. Blessed are you who are poor. Woe to you who are rich.

Twenty-Third Saturday in Ordinary Time:

1 Tim 1:15-17; Luke 6:43-49. Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. Why do you call me, "Lord, Lord," but do not do what I command?

Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

Isa 50:5-9a; Jas 2:14-18; Mark 8:27-35. I gave my back to those who beat me. Faith, if it does not have works, is dead. You are the Christ... the Son of Man must suffer greatly.
