From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

Grace and peace to you in our Lord Jesus Christ, today and always. By the time you read this column (unless you're one of those among us who check the parish website for an advanced look at our bulletins!), our Holy Father Pope Francis will have visited our fair city and departed. Frs. Peter, Sean, and I will have attended the papal mass at Madison Square Garden along with a lucky group of our parishioners. The prayer vigils preceding the pope's visit will have happened. Francis will have addressed the United Nations and visited Our Lady Queen of Angels School in East Harlem. He will have blessed our beautiful Central Park in a great procession. And while Pope Francis is in Philadelphia for the last leg of his American journey, we will be talking about all the good things that happened when he was here in our midst.

There has been so much excitement leading up to the pope's visit and rightfully so. But very soon, an important question will become obvious: "What Next?" Now that Francis has come and gone, what do we do next? How do we keep the momentum of his visit going?

I have been so impressed by the various responses to our parish effort to address the problems of climate change and environmental degradation. One ministry after another is finding a way that's right for them to embrace the call of Francis to heal our damaged planet. Let me encourage you to keep all of that going as one way of answering the question "What Next?" There are others ways as well and the Spirit will guide us to them.

Also, let's not forget what's coming up in October: the Ordinary Synod on the Family in Rome and then the start of the worldwide Jubilee Year of Mercy in December. In short, the Holy Spirit is clearly moving within the Church and in the world. This is an ecclesial moment, a pivotal time to move forward in the kingdom of God. And yet, even in the light of all this, I cannot forget a haunting observation that one of our beloved, longtime parishioners recently made to me in private. She said "Fr. Marina, I love Pope Francis with all my heart. But I'm worried that Jesus is beginning to take a back seat to him!"

Wow! How does a pastor respond to a concern like that? I felt for her very much and appreciated her wonderful honesty. But, based on what little I know of Francis personally, I'm guessing that overshadowing Jesus (if that's possible) is the absolute last thing he would ever want to do. In fact, as soon as our pope spots the 225 ft. high mural of his persona on 34th and 8th, he is bound to be disappointed that the mural was not one of our Lord instead.

The Holy Father is the Vicar of Christ on earth. The two are linked forever as the pope represents Jesus Christ in a way that no other human person can. But still, our parishioner is right. In the end, it always has to be about Jesus. Regardless of charisma or affect, integrity or impact, we look to Christ and we follow him. All good leaders, even popes, come and go but the Son of God is ours forever. Francis is leading the way to Christ, as all good Christians should. And he is doing so uniquely, as his vicar and in such wonderful fashion. So this isn't an either/or scenario. We have Pope Francis and we have Jesus Christ. We can never make the mistake of equating the vicar with the one he represents. The former must always yield to the latter. And what an amazing yield we are seeing! So let us continue to look to Francis to lead us to Jesus, trusting that the Spirit is already among us. Because whenever we are visited by that presence and it is felt within our hearts, we are bound to ask the question "What next?"

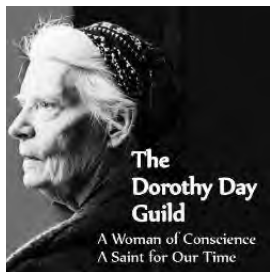

Stewardship News

Thank you to all of you who have given so much of your time, talent, and treasure to support our parish throughout the year. The Finance Council is pleased to present the preliminary financial results for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2015. The Statement of Support summarizes revenues and expenditures for last year compared to budget and the budget for the new fiscal year that started September 1st. Our final financial results will be included in our 2015 Annual Report that is planned for distribution on the first Sunday of Advent, November 29th.

We finished the year with a surplus of \$42,990 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$111,075. The favorable results are due to increased giving in donations & bequests, Sunday collections, weddings, the Christmas collection, and votive candles. Our Sunday offertory collections were 10.1% higher than budget due in large part to the success of our Sharing God's Gifts Increased Giving Program. Our thanks to all who are participating in this important program. Our planned deficit for this year is \$74,000 and therefore we ask that you prayerfully consider increasing your donations this year, if you can. We need your increased support in the coming year through your Sunday offertory, maintenance 2nd collection, and Christmas and Easter gifts to help reduce this deficit.

Why We Need Your Support

Thank you for your generous support this past fiscal year. You might question, “Does the parish need my gift? Does my weekly financial contribution make a difference? What expenses go into the parish’s budget?” Without your support we simply would not be the vibrant parish community that we are today. Our operating expense budget for the fiscal year that started on September 1st is \$2.1 million. Below is a breakdown of our budget and the ways your support is needed and does make a difference. Our planned deficit for this year is \$74,000 and therefore we ask that you prayerfully consider increasing your donations this year, if you can. We need your increased support in the coming year through your Sunday offertory, maintenance 2nd collection, Christmas and Easter gifts to help cover these costs.



Clergy and Lay Administrative/Maintenance Salary & Benefits: The budget of \$596,000 includes the salary and benefits costs of our three priests and three full time and five part-time lay administrative and maintenance employees, and stipends for visiting priests. Benefits include healthcare and retirement costs and payroll related taxes. Living expenses plus travel and retreat allowances are also included for our priests.

Restoration Loan: The parish borrowed \$6 million in 2009 to fund part of the restoration expenses for the interior portion of the church. We will make principal and interest payments of \$556,000 annually until the loan is paid off in March of 2021.



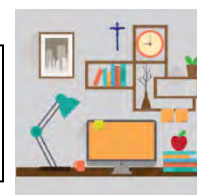
Archdiocesan Assessments: The Diocese funds its pastoral and administrative functions through an assessment on all Parishes equal to 8% of revenues. Our assessment for this year is \$147,000. We also contribute \$144,000 annually to support elementary schools within the Global Regional School System of the Archdiocese.

Music Ministry: Our budget of \$157,000 funds the salaries and benefits of the Director and Assistant Director of Music, stipends for Cantors, musicians for special liturgies, upkeep of our organ, pianos & handbells, special musical events, and the purchase of music related supplies and equipment.



Maintenance, Repairs, and Utilities: Our utilities budget of \$50,000 pays for the electricity used for lighting, powering office equipment and air conditioning and the steam used for heating. Maintenance and repair expenses are budgeted at \$79,000

Support Expenses (Non-salary): Our Support Expenses budget of \$123,000 covers a wide range of expenditures in support of the operations of the church and back-office. These expenses include copier, printing, computer, telephone, postage, office supplies, liturgical & sacristy supplies, and fees paid to our parish accountant and FaithDirect.



Religious Education: Our Religious Education budget includes both our Family Faith and RCIA programs. The budget of \$106,000 includes the salary and benefits of our Director of Religious Education, stipends for catechists and guest speakers, books & supplies, and other program costs.

Insurance: To minimize the financial loss associated with various risks such as a fire or a slip and fall we purchase a wide variety of insurance policies. Our budget of \$102,000 includes the costs of our property, flood, earthquake, liability, employee dishonesty & crime, and equipment breakdown policies in addition to the retainer paid to our insurance consultant.



Stewardship and other Programs: The budget of \$82,000 includes the salary and benefits costs of the two part time employees and other costs associated with our Stewardship efforts. In addition we cover the expenses of programs not included above such as food & beverages, stipends for guest speakers, and charitable contributions to other organizations.
