GLOBAL CATHOLIC CLIMATE PETITION DRIVE

“On climate change, there is a clear, definitive and ineluctable ethical imperative to act.” — Pope Francis

Next week-end, the Peace and Justice Committee will again promote an initiative that helps us as Catholics and as global citizens to respond to *Laudato Si’, On Care for Our Common Home*. We will be at tables in the back of church before and after every Mass encouraging you to sign the **Catholic Climate Petition**, which is endorsed by Pope Francis and has been signed by a number of cardinals and bishops.

The **Catholic Climate Petition** is an initiative of the Global Catholic Climate Movement, GCCM, aimed at raising a strong Catholic voice at the Paris Climate Summit this December to exhort world leaders to commit to significantly reducing greenhouse gases and to aiding the countries most affected by climate change. The petition will be delivered in person by GCCM to leaders of the Paris Climate Summit, which starts Nov. 30. **Supporters must sign the petition by Thanksgiving week-end, so outreach to friends and family is urgent.**

The GCCM website, www.catholicclimatemovement.global, offers the opportunity to sign the petition online, and we hope you will send this link to your Catholic friends throughout the country and post it on your Facebook page to encourage a strong climate agreement in Paris. (You do not have to be Catholic to sign it.) Take a step towards being a good steward of our common home by signing and promoting the **Catholic Climate Petition**.... for God’s creation, the poor and future generations.

GCCM is a coalition of over 150 Catholic organizations, including Catholic Charities from many countries, religious congregations, LCWR, Conference of Major Superiors of Men (USA), Pax Christi International, the Catholic Climate Covenant (supported by the U.S. bishops), as well as the Ignatian Solidarity Network, the Ignatian Volunteer Corps, and the Franciscan Action Network.

PADRE MELO WILL BE HERE NEXT WEEK

Next Sunday, November 15, Padre Melo from Honduras will concelebrate the 11:30 mass here at Xavier. At 1 PM, the Honduras Companion Communities Project and the Peace and Justice Group will provide a chance for parishioners to meet with Padre Melo in the church. After introductions and brief remarks, we will have a free-flowing dialogue on issues such as the mass migration of Hondurans, the struggles and successes of building a fair and inclusive society in a country such as Honduras, and how one maintains hope in an environment where nothing seems to change. Coffee and refreshments will be provided in the Mary Chapel immediately before the meeting.

Padre Melo is a Jesuit priest and human rights activist in his native Honduras. He directs the Jesuit radio station, Radio Progreso, and ERIC, the Team for Reflection, Research and Communication, whose work focuses on grassroots training on human rights, community organizing, and empowerment and the formation of leadership committed to social change. Last month, Padre Melo was awarded the prestigious Rafto Prize for Human Rights by the Rafto Foundation. He delivered the keynote speech at the awards ceremony in Bergen, Norway, on November 1.

A CHRISTIAN DAY OF ATONEMENT

Every year our Jewish friends celebrate Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement. It is the holiest day of the year in the Jewish calendar concluding a ten day period of repentance. Atonement is larger than individual forgiveness and it addresses a level of sin that is larger than what we Christians present in individual confession. Atonement addresses what I call sin too large: social sin, sins of discrimination, war, systems that abuse the poor and the unwanted.

Atonement is a prayer that takes all the sins in the world, and especially those over which we have little control and presents them to the God of mercy who alone knows how to embrace and respond to them. The prayer of Atonement belongs to the Christian community as well since we too must deal with sin too large.

On Friday evening, November 13th, we at St. Francis Xavier will celebrate a Christian Day of Atonement. In our own faith, social sin, war, discrimination, everything that is sin too large cries out for the healing power of Jesus Christ. Yet we have no ritual to present such sin to the mercy of Christ. The Christian Day of Atonement is a ritual to do just that.

The Ritual involves three distinct moments. The first looks at our own sinfulness as a Xavier community. Beyond private confession, how do we present our sinfulness to Jesus Christ? Water will be the prime symbol. After a confession of sinfulness, those who wish will come forward to wash their hands in the water that has been blessed. A prayer of forgiveness is then prayed over all.

The second moment sees the sinfulness of the Church. Such sinfulness is no surprise since we are a human church. But sins of abuse, sins of neglect, the misuse of power and the fear of change all constitute the Church itself as sinner, not just the individuals who are part of it. As a symbol of the Church being cleansed, the four faces of the Altar will be washed while a hymn to the holiness of God will be sung.

Finally, the sinfulness of the world. What shall we mention? War, of course. Deception, certainly. Killings in schools, refusals to welcome immigrants, discrimination of all kinds. All these and more cry out to God for mercy. As a symbol the priest or leader will sprinkle water to the four corners of the earth, proclaiming the victory of Christ.

Please come and join us on Friday evening, **November 13th, at 7:00 pm** for our celebration of Atonement, calling on the mercy of God and the healing power of Jesus Christ.
