From the Pastor's Desk

I hope 2016 is off to a wonderful start for all of you. As you read this message, I am in Florida, warming up and celebrating a late Christmas with my family. For many years now, we have celebrated in January because my responsibilities do not permit to be home on Christmas day itself. But as my father used to say, "Joe, Christmas arrives in our family whenever your plane lands." Even now, I still can almost hear his voice.

But never mind the Marina's. Let's continue to bask in the glow of Christmas right here at Xavier, which seemed more splendid and sacred than ever (if that's possible). Many thanks to all of you who worked so hard in anticipation of the great Feast. MODERN DAY SLAVERY**

- Human Trafficking, also known as modern-day slavery, involves the recruitment, harboring or transportation of people who are exploited through forms of force, fraud or coercion.
- Modern-Day Slavery has replaced whips and chains with emotional, mental and physical abuse that produces psychological bondage, often referred to as the Stockholm Syndrome.
- Human Trafficking has been reported in EVERY state in the United States.
- Human Trafficking is the 2nd largest criminal industry in the world, second only to the drug trade and generates an estimated \$32 billion per year. (UN)
- New York is one of the top 5 states with the highest number of reported cases.
- It is estimated that there are 21 million people in slavery today around the world.

“Is God’s Charity Broad Enough for Bears?”

Dr. Elizabeth Johnson

Until recently, the natural world was not a subject of much religious interest to the church at large. This is now changing as the world faces an ecological crisis of great magnitude. Starting with John Muir’s question about the bears, this presentation explores the meaning of creation in a new context. It draws from Pope Francis’ encyclical *Laudato Si’* and the speaker’s book *“Ask the Beasts: Darwin and the God of Love”* to explore how loving the Earth can become an intrinsic part of faith in God, rather than an add-on.
