Dear Friends in Christ,

During this Lenten season, as we prepare for new life, I write to share with you details that concern upcoming changes in our beloved parish.

Fr. Joseph Marina, S.J., has served you wonderfully over the past three years. Many of you have spoken of your appreciation for him, of his outstanding homilies, and his pastoral care for the sick and the dying. However, as is so often the case in the life of Jesuits, Fr. Marina has been asked to move on to a new assignment after a period of spiritual discernment. He will leave Xavier at the end of June to assume the position of Provost/Academic Vice President at Le Moyne College in Syracuse, NY. I urge you to make Fr. Marina aware of your affection and gratitude as he prepares to depart.

Fr. Peter Fink, S.J., will transition to a new ministry as well, as I have missioned him to St. Ignatius Retreat Center in Atlanta. You may know that Fr. Fink lived in Atlanta once before, as he pursued his doctorate in theology at Emory University. He has made a tremendous contribution to Xavier over the last ten years, especially through his work in the celebration of weddings, creating beautiful liturgies, and leading the Rites of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) program each year. I am sure that you will miss Fr. Fink, and I encourage you to wish him well in his new assignment.

Cardinal Timothy Dolan, Archbishop of New York, has accepted my nomination of Fr. Robert VerEecke, S.J., as your next pastor. Fr. VerEecke has served for many years as pastor of St. Ignatius Parish, which is adjacent to Boston College. There, he received countless accolades for weaving the arts into the life of the parish. I firmly believe that Fr. VerEecke is the right Jesuit to guide Xavier into the future, and I trust that you will receive him warmly.

Happily, Fr. Sean Toole, S.J., will remain at Xavier for a second year, aiding in the transition to a new pastor. In addition, I have asked Kevin Spinale, S.J., who will be ordained to the priesthood this June, to spend his first summer as a priest at Xavier. In the same way that you have so graciously welcomed other Jesuits to the Xavier clerical staff in the past, I trust that you will mentor him into this ministry of priestly service.

Please be assured of my prayers, and know that I will be grateful for your remembering the Society of Jesus and me when you pray.

## MARCH IS WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH!



Throughout the month of March, we celebrate and honor the rich history of women throughout the world. We look toward remarkable women for inspiration.

Throughout the Gospels, we bear witness to Jesus' deep concern and love for women. During his time, women lived on the fringes of society. Jesus radically elevated the dignity of women: he conversed openly with women, listened deeply to women, and advocated passionately for women. In today's Gospel, we hear of a woman accused and condemned by many men, but not by Jesus.
