From the Desk of Fr. Peter

As most of you already know, I will be leaving St. Francis Xavier in June heading to Ignatius House Retreat Center in Atlanta, Georgia. Coming to Xavier was for me a homecoming for my first assignment as a Jesuit was to teach physics and math at the High School next door. And as a kid from the Bronx, New York City always has a claim on me. Going to Atlanta also is a bit of a homecoming. After Ordination I spent five years there as a graduate student at Emory University building friendships that last even to today. My return to the South fulfills that wonderful southern cry: “Y’al come back now, heah!”

Leaving Weston Jesuit School of Theology after 31 years was both sad and filled with hope. I used to say that Weston was a place that was run on affection, and the sadness came from saying goodbye to students and colleagues who remain a profound part of my life. The hope was to join the women and men of Xavier as priest and as friend, entering this wonderful journey of prayer, care and love. Ten years now, that hope has been fulfilled far more than I could have realized, and the word “thank you” isn’t really enough to say what is now in my heart. If Weston was run on affection, Xavier is run on faith, on commitment, on challenge, on daring, and of course, finally, on love.

So I leave here as I left Weston with sadness and hope. Sadness because I leave so many friends, people of faith, people of courage and people who love. Hope because the mission at the retreat house will bring faith and friendship in a new way into my life. It will probably be a final mission before I make that journey into God’s waiting hands, and I am thrilled to embrace it.

When I left Weston, I realized that Weston itself was ending, becoming the School of Theology and Ministry at Boston College. Much that we had in Cambridge changed, some of it lost. But the spirit of the school, to train compassionate and courageous people to serve in our Church, does not change. The same is true for Xavier. God has given us much growth in my short time here, and I am confident that such growth will continue. It has been said so often that you as a community invite that growth and I can only hope that beyond all our conflicting needs and desires that sense of welcome and challenge will still stand forth.

In the words of our mission statement, go forth as a “prophetic, welcoming community, as an inclusive witness to the presence of Christ in our midst.” And send me forth as a prophetic and welcoming person to bring Christ with me as priest and as worker to Ignatius House Retreat Center. God bless. I love you all very much.
