MEET KEVIN SPINALE S.J., THE NEWEST MEMBER OF OUR COMMUNITY

Greetings. My name is Kevin Spinale, and I am originally from Arlington, MA – about 6 miles west of Boston Common. I am delighted to have the opportunity to work at Xavier Parish this summer. I have often stayed at the Jesuit community next door, and I have enjoyed worshipping with the Xavier community from time to time. I am always impressed by how many parishioners participate in the liturgies. It is a vibrant, diverse, urban parish, and I look forward to participating in the life of the community.

I have been a Jesuit for ten and a half years. I hit the floor and was ordained a priest on June 11th at Fordham University. Before that, I served as a deacon at Gate of Heaven and St. Brigid's parishes in South Boston as I completed two degrees at Boston College. My time working in Southie was wonderful, and I learned a great deal in preaching regularly.

But for the first four years of college, I have either been a teacher or a student – sometimes both. I have had a great deal of schooling in fact: University of Toronto, University of Chicago, and – now – Boston College. As a plodding school in my future.

I entered the Jesuits after my two years in New York. I was drawn to the Society of Jesus because of my Jesuit education, and the Christocentric spirituality that animates the Ignatian charism. Contemplation of the life of Christ – particularly the public ministry, passion, and death of Jesus – remains the core of my prayer and my vocation.

As a Jesuit, I have traveled widely and been able to minister in jails, hospitals, hospices, and schools. Most recently, I taught English and coached rugby at my alma mater, Boston College High School.

I am genuinely excited to be assigned to serve at Xavier this summer in my first assignment after ordination. Whenever I enter the church, I am most impressed by the altar constructed out of the wood of kneelers on which the Xavier community knelt in worship for over 125 years. The altar unites Christ's presence in the Eucharist with lives of parishioners and the history of Xavier Church. It is a clear mark of our incarnate God and the union of the parish community in its celebration of the Eucharist. This summer I hope to serve the Xavier community as a new priest and learn how to help lead worship in a lively, urban Jesuit parish. Please be patient with me as I learn the ropes.

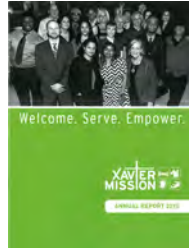
