From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

I'm writing this letter on Election Day. I would have liked to wait until tomorrow to find out the results of the election but I'm under the pressure of a "deadline". To say that I'm feeling anxious, apprehensive and "on edge" as we anticipate the results of this contentious election, is not an understatement! I know what I "hope" for but don't yet know what the outcome will be.

The above paragraph sounds a good deal like Advent! Anxiety, apprehension, anticipation, "being on edge" describe the feelings that accompany our Advent journey each year. And Advent is only two Sundays away! In preparation for the season I met with a number of parishioners who shared their thoughts about the scriptures and the themes of Advent. This particular Advent. (Cycle A with the readings from Matthew) evokes feelings of joy and anticipation at the same time that it envisions a world where "peace and justice" embrace. While we wait for the beginning of a new year and a new liturgical cycle, we have the opportunity to celebrate and give thanks for the blessings which we have received as a parish community. As I said this past weekend, there is an abundance of generosity at Xavier that is expressed in parishioners' willingness to share their "time", "talent" and "treasure". In regards to the "treasure", again let me ask you to consider signing up for our "Faith Direct" on-line giving. It would be wonderful if we could reach the 500 mark by the end of 2016. Presently there are 340 parishioners who are using Faith Direct. And remember it's not a matter of "how much" but "how many" so we can better plan to meet the needs of our ever-growing parish and its ministries.

*A new play with rap based on over 200 interviews with the guests of
the Xavier Mission Welcome Table Soup Kitchen*

Shara Ashley Zeiger's *Roughly Speaking*, was conceived and produced by The Platform Group, in cooperation with Xavier Mission's Welcome Table Soup Kitchen. *Roughly Speaking* will be presented at Tada, located at 15 West 28th Street from October 29 through November 20.



Roughly Speaking presents a look into the world we walk by through the eyes of Lightning Bolt, a rapper bound only by his wheelchair and a cast of diverse characters on a not so typical day at the soup kitchen. An existential struggle of survival begs questions of love, loss, and what's next. *Roughly Speaking* is a drama with rap about those who are caught in a system that exists more to maintain the status quo, rather than offer a way out. It's funny. It's sad. It's not a docudrama monologue play.

A talk back series line-up includes experts on the homeless, a member of the New York State Assembly, TED Talk Presenters, artists, and members of the *Roughly Speaking* cast and creative team, and are scheduled to take place after every Wednesday and Sunday performance.

Show times for *Roughly Speaking* are Wednesday-Saturday at 8pm, Sunday at 2pm. There will be an additional performance on Monday, November 14 at 8pm and no performance on Sunday October 30, or Wednesday, November 16. For the Greater Glory of God, a dance/ theater piece inspired by the Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius of Loyola was created by Fr. Bob VerEecke for the Ignatian Anniversaries of 1991-1992. The first performance took place in the Sanctuary of St Ignatius parish, Chestnut Hill and was subsequently performed at many Jesuit Universities and parishes across the country and in Canada. It's most recent live performance took place two years ago in St Anne's parish in Kingston, Jamaica. The work combines music, dance, scripture and the text of the Spiritual Exercises in a way that invites the audience to experience the dynamics of the 4 "weeks" of the Exercises. The role of St Ignatius is played by Father VerEecke.

For the Greater Glory of God invites those familiar with the Exercises into an aesthetic encounter with the movements of the four weeks and introduces the newcomer to the power and richness of Ignatius' most profound contribution to our spiritual tradition.

Jeremy Zipple S.J. a professional videographer and media director at America Magazine videoed the work two years ago using multiple cameras. Screening of the video version of For the Greater Glory of God will take place on Wednesday, November 16th in the Xavier High School Theater (Keenan Commons) at 7PM. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Ignatian Social Justice, the Xavier Peace & Justice Committee, and Bread for the World will be presenting a “**Poverty Simulation**” on **Saturday, November 19th from 10:00am-12:30pm at the Church of St. Ignatius Loyola 980 Park Avenue, New York, NY.** A poverty simulation is intended to help participants understand what it might be like to be part of a typical low income family trying to survive from month to month. It is a simulation, not a game. The object is to sensitize participants to the realities of life faced by those who find themselves on the margins of human life and society, while providing concrete suggestions for further action and advocacy! Please prayerfully consider how best to mourn those living in poverty, and help put an end to their suffering.
