From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

This past Monday, your Pastoral Council met to reflect together on some of the issues that were raised during our February day of reflection and planning. One of the most urgent was a pastoral response to the needs of our brothers and sisters who are afraid of deportation and being separated from their families. In this Lenten season we have the opportunity to put into practice the gospel of mercy and compassion that we hear in Matthew 25. "When did we see you hungry, homeless, in prison, etc. and care for you?" Jesus' response is "Whenever you did this to the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it to me". In the light of this challenge to recognize the human dignity of each person, many of you have asked how we can respond as a parish community. A number of parishioners have been involved in "Know your rights" training as well as exploring the process of becoming a "short term" sanctuary Church. I met with Fr Julian who directs the Migrant Center at St Francis and he has encouraged us to let parishioners know how they can volunteer at the center. He also asked us to sponsor a forum on Immigration that we are in the process of planning. The parish's relationship with the Mercy Center in the Bronx gives us another opportunity to know the stories of many who have come to our country seeking refuge and hope. There is also a 24 hour program "City of Refuge" on March 14th/15th You can find more information on this in the bulletin.

May the "transfiguring" light of Jesus Christ guide our way during these challenging times when we are called to see each person as a brother and sister and all as "children of God".

SOR JUANA INÉS DE LA CRUZ: THE FORMIDABLE 17TH CENTURY FEMINIST YOU’VE NEVER HEARD OF

Sor Juana Inés de la Cruz, O.S.H. (November 12, 1651 – April 17, 1695), was a Mexican nun of the order of Saint Jerome (Hieronymite). She was a notorious self-taught scholar, mystic, philosopher and poet of the Baroque school of New Spain, known in her lifetime as “The Tenth Muse”, or “The Phoenix of America.” The title also suggestive that she may have been a lesbian. Juana learned to read at age 3. By age 8 she was studying Latin and pursuing interests in every field of knowledge.

Xavier Family: Listening to our Different Voices “All are Welcome” has been a hallmark of the Xavier community for as long as we can remember. However, the divisiveness that erupted from the Presidential election has made it difficult to hear our diverse views without triggering a negative emotional reaction. This is regrettable as it not only tears down the fabric of our Gospel message, but also makes us lose sight of the fact that we are ONE in CHRIST. Lent offers us an opportunity for a faith community such as ours to recommit itself to the Body of Christ because we truly believe “all are welcome”.

In response to this dynamic, the Pastoral Council and the Xavier Peace and Justice Committee invite us as a community to:
