From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

I'm writing this to you on Monday, a rainy, relatively cold day in the hopes that the weather will be bright, sunny and summerlike for this Memorial Day Weekend. One can always hope! And that should be our outlook as followers of Jesus Christ. We wait in joyful hope! This time between Ascension and Pentecost is a time of "waiting in joyful hope". We not only have the promise of the coming of the Spirit, we already have the Spirit moving in us and with us as a community of faith.

I was witness to the Spirit moving tonight as I attended the LSTEP Graduation for 5 participants who have spent the past 14 weeks sharing their stories, their hopes and dreams for the future with each other and with their mentors. Each person spoke of the challenges that they had faced including addiction, abuse, imprisonment, homelessness and each witnessed to the power of the Spirit leading them to a better life through the commitment of people who wanted to be there for them. It was so very moving to hear the witness of each of the LSTEP graduates.

Most of our stories are not as dramatic as those of the persons participating in L-STEP but each of us knows the challenges we face to be more loving and more open to the Spirit moving in our own lives. I hope and pray that this time between Ascension and Pentecost will be a true "memorial" as we remember God's gracious love for us and as we "wait in joyful hope!"

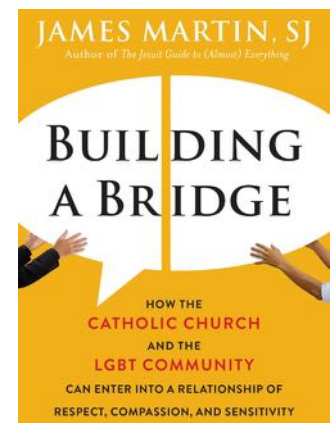
