From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

This past week my reflections for the daily Masses have been on “generosity”. One of the days I asked people whether they thought that being generous is a matter of “nature” or “nurture”. Are we born with Generosity Genes or do we need to learn from others what it means to be generous? The study of young children who do not want to share what they have would seem to indicate that we have to “learn” to be generous. As St Ignatius says in his prayer for Generosity. “Lord, teach me to be generous. To give and not to count the cost.” I do think others “model” generosity for us and that helps us to be more generous with our “time, talent and treasure”.

As you well know, this is Fr. Sean's last formal week of ministry at Xavier. In only two years time, Sean has made such an impact on this parish. The standing ovation he received last Sunday after the 11:30 was a well-deserved tribute to the person, priest and Jesuit he has been for this community. Although I have only been with Sean for less than a year, I have been so moved by his generosity. He is tireless in his commitment to the parish, to the work of the Mission, to inter-faith dialogue, to couples who are preparing for marriage and so many more. He is a “model” of generosity who has clearly taken to heart the Ignatian prayer! I know you join me in thanking Sean for his service as he so often thanks all of you for being his “teachers” in ministry.

Speaking of “Generosity”, I want to take this opportunity to thank the many volunteers who so generously serve the parish in liturgical, social, spiritual, pastoral, and “pragmatic” ways. We simply wouldn't be the parish we are without our volunteers who make such a difference in the quality of our parish life. You should all take great PRIDE in who you are as people with great heart and spirit.

Speaking of Heart, this past Friday was the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. If there is anyone who models God's generosity for us, it's Jesus Christ and the symbol of his “heart” beautifully reminds us that we are called to give of ourselves as he has given so generously of himself.

Do immigrants increase the crime rate?

Research shows that immigrant communities do not increase the crime rate. Immigrants actually commit fewer crimes than native-born Americans. The number of undocumented immigrants living in the US tripled from 3.5 million to 11 million between 1990 and 2013, but the corresponding violent crime rate declined by 48%. There was a 41% reduction in property crime over the same period.

BECOMING A CATECHIST

REGISTRATION

All families coming for Religious Education for the first time need to be registered in the Parish before enrolling in the Religious Education Program.

Please bring the following required documents when coming to register:

- a) A copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate.
- b) A statement (transcript) of all prior Religious Education if the student is beyond first grade.
- c) First Holy Communion, if the sacrament has already been received.
- d) Registration fees in a check payable to the Church of St. Francis Xavier.

Families currently attending our program need to be re-registered. Please bring the Registration fees in a check payable to the Church of St. Francis Xavier when coming to re-register.

Registration/Re-registration will take place on Sunday August 13, 20 and 27 from 10:30 am to 11:30 am in the West Room.

Tuition for the 2017-2018 school year is \$100 per student, which includes the textbook, supplies, additional instructional materials, catechists' and catechist assistants' stipend. There is also a \$50 Sacramental Fee for children preparing for First Holy Communion (2nd grade) and Confirmation (7th grade) to contribute to Bishop's stipend and Pottery retreat cost. Snacks fee is \$80 per family.

Are you looking for a way to share your faith, time and talents with others? The Family Faith Program needs you!!

Volunteers are needed as catechists (teachers) and catechist aides. You don't have to have a child in our program to volunteer. We encourage all adults to prayerfully consider whether this ministry is right for you. All volunteers must be cleared through our Safe Environment program. We will provide training and support along the way.
