From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

"My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples". This weekend we hear scriptures that speak of God's openness to all peoples. Both the first reading from the prophet Isaiah as well as the Gospel where Jesus is challenged to extend his ministry to the Gentiles, symbolized by the Canaanite woman, reveal God's desires for all people to be welcomed as God's own people. The recent displays of bigotry, racism, neo-Nazism and the ensuing violence in Charlottesville are terrible reminders that those who advocate these forms of bigotry have chosen a path of alienation from God and the human community. It is very sad to think that many of those with Anti-Semitic and racist views may actually consider themselves "Christians". I am reminded of the song, "They will know we are Christians by our love". To be a follower of Jesus demands that we love the other as Christ has loved us, even one's enemies. Throughout history we have seen how the power of evil has been manifest in heartless human beings who choose death over life, hatred over love, prejudice over respect for the human dignity of each person. I hope and pray that our religious leaders and those in government office can model for us what it means to speak out against prejudice and speak on behalf of the common good for all.



THE XAVIER IMMIGRATION INITIATIVE INVITES YOU TO SPEAK UP FOR IMMIGRANTS -SHARE REAL FACTS NOT ALTERNATIVE FACTS

MYTH: The process for admitting refugees to the United States is not secure and terrorists can easily enter the country.

FACT: The most difficult way to enter the United States legally is as a refugee. No other category of traveler to the United States undergoes such a rigorous and detailed screening process. The process typically takes 18-24 months and involves numerous federal intelligence and security agencies, including the Department of Homeland Security, the Department of State, the Department of Defense, the National Counterterrorism Center, and the FBI.

Fewer than 1% of all refugees are even considered for resettlement. If referred to the U.S. program, refugees undergo biographic and fingerprint security checks to confirm their identity. They are also extensively interviewed by specially trained officers from DHS' U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS). The vetting process is designed to ensure that each incoming refugee is not a public safety or national security risk. The review process for Syrian refugees has intensified and includes additional layers of security screening. Ultimately, if our government has concerns that an applicant is a threat or safety risk, that refugee will not be admitted to the United States.
