From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Can you believe it's NOVEMBER! Where did the time go? All of a sudden we find ourselves in this month of memory, especially the memory of our deceased loved ones. There is something appropriate about "Remembering" this month with its religious and secular holidays including All Saints, All Souls, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving. Throughout this month we take the time to remember those people in our lives who have enriched us with their love. And we give thanks for them, especially at our Eucharistic table each Sunday.

One of the anomalies of this liturgical year is that we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King of the Universe on the Sunday after Thanksgiving. This means that Advent begins on December 3rd. 

THE XAVIER IMMIGRATION INITIATIVE URGES YOU TO LEARN MORE: WHO ARE THE DREAMERS?

Data about NY Dreamers was presented in a lawsuit filed by NY State Attorney General Eric Schneiderman, along with attorney generals from 14 other states and the District of Columbia.

Of the approximately 42,000 Dreamers in the state of NY:

- 91.4% are currently employed
- 94.2% of working Dreamers own a business, employing other Americans
- 44.9% are currently enrolled in school (many are studying and working at the same time)
- 72.7% live in "mixed families" meaning some family members are US citizens.

These statistics, even though they are estimates, indicate how much ending DACA protections could disrupt local economies and upend many lives.
