From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Mary Magdalene, Apostle to the Apostles. It is very much thanks to the efforts of one woman, Rita Ann Houlihan, a great friend of Xavier, that Rome officially changed a "memorial" to a "feast". I'd like to share with you a section of the letter that she wrote to Pope Francis in June of 2015. The "official" proclamation of her "feast" on July 22nd was made in February of 2016.

Most Holy Father,

This letter brings many prayers and greetings from New York City. It also brings a simple, but urgent request for a formal, corrective Papal Teaching regarding St. Mary of Magdala's true role in salvation history. For centuries our church has misrepresented her as as the "sinful Magdalene" and some continue this error today. This distorts the Gospel and has virtually erased our memory of her as one of the disciples Jesus included among those who "came up from Galilee with him." (Luke 23:55) As a Church that champions itself as the keeper of the deposit of true faith, we are obliged to teach the truth about Mary of Magdala.

We need an official Papal Teaching that 1) presents the true Gospel story of Mary of Magdala, the faithful disciple who remained, unflinching at the cross, led the visit to Jesus' tomb and was chosen by the Risen Christ as his witness and proclaimer of the Resurrection and 2) rejects and corrects the erroneous depiction of her as the anonymous, sinful woman in Luke 7:36-50 or any other woman in scripture. This erroneous depiction derives from an ancient, negative stereotype, not from Jesus' teaching or example. It dismisses her leadership and prevents others from experiencing her faith and witness.

Learning about the depth of St. Mary of Magdala's faith and witness has been life changing; it opened my eyes to the love and inclusiveness of Jesus, as shown in the Gospel and continues to nurture me in ways I never could have imagined. I have seen the joy of similar awakenings in others. This rekindling of my faith through Mary of Magdala's witness is a gift I am compelled to share.

A formal, Papal Teaching confirming the truth and rejecting the distortions will allow all to experience her faith and love in action and to hear, through her, Jesus' powerful Resurrection message. It will inspire and empower us, especially our young women to become personal evangelizers of this Good News.

We are so grateful to Rita for the gift of the bronze relief "Mary Magdala Proclaims the Resurrection", commissioned by her and executed by Sr. Peggy Beaudette, SC.

And the whole church is grateful for her advocacy for St Mary of Magdala who is now restored to her rightful place in the company of the saints as Apostle to the Apostles.

New Sanctuary Coalition

When Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) orders our friends deported, their loved ones can pack one 25 lb suitcase for them. Each day, people in our communities must pack such a suitcase and submit it to ICE for inspection. When they drop off these suitcases with ICE, they cannot see their loved one to say goodbye.

Some of our friends and neighbors are deported to countries they left as children, where they know no one and may not speak the language. They often face grave danger.

We are asking you to think about one person—someone you love—and imagine packing their suitcase before they were deported to a country where you might never see them again. We invite you to think about this choice: what objects, what pieces of clothing, what photos, what books, what letters would you pack?

On July 26th, at 5:30pm, we will gather at 26 Federal Plaza in New York City to honor those who have been deported and their loved ones—and to make visible this form of invisible violence.

Who Deserves Asylum?

Public outrage led the Trump administration to end its policy of separating immigrant families. However, this administration continues to dismantle the protections that asylum in the US offers.



Many of those seeking asylum are fleeing gang violence and domestic violence in Central America. Just last month, though, the Justice Department announced that victims of domestic abuse and gang violence no longer qualify for asylum under federal law in most cases.

Critics of this new policy believe that asylum offers a lifeline to people fleeing widespread human rights abuses in their home countries.

Who deserves asylum? Should abused women and those fleeing rampant gang violence be denied asylum? What do you think?
