From the Desk of Fr. Dan

Our liturgical calendar is coming to the end of the year. As Advent begins (Dec 2) so does our new Church year. Just as we do at the end of the Gregorian (western, civil) calendar year, we are taking stock of where we are. Our readings offer some sense of the reality in which we find ourselves today.

In our readings this weekend we hear of times of tribulation and disruption. I always hope to find some consolation in the fact that times of tribulation are not confined to these present times, but that consolation is fleeting. The reality is we do face turbulent times. The rise of nationalism, racism, abuse by clergy and bishops and antisemitism highlight the reality of injustice in our society. While we can point to movements like #MeToo and #BlackLivesMatter as signs of hope, they are signs of hope against incredible structures of injustice.

Amid that we read that "the wise shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament, and those who lead the many to justice shall be like the stars forever" (Daniel 12:3). This is our call, to be the wise ones who shine brightly. There are three areas of hope that I want to highlight.

First, many of our parishioners are involved in the 5 Theses Movement which calls for important reforms in our church. They were part of a protest at many cathedrals last weekend and at the gathering of Catholic Bishops in Baltimore. Please see the website for more information. https://www.5theses.com/

Second, as a parish rooted in the Ignatian tradition we are part of the Ignatian Solidarity Network and their Campaign for Hospitality. This collaborative work of justice and advocacy reminds us that all people are created in the image and likeness of God. Third, we continue our prayers for our own parishioners who have been accompanying some of the most marginalized in Jamaica this last week. We are delighted to welcome home the Xavier group from their time at Mustard Seed in Kingston, Jamaica.
