





The Oil of the Sick

An oil blessed to anoint those who are ill: a prayer of comfort and compassion offered in the pastoral care of the sick.

The Oil of Catechumens

An oil blessed to be used in baptism: a saving oil, a prayer for conversion, an invitation to listen to the word of God.

All:

Through anointing with this oil may our catechumens be made ready to hear the word of God and advance to the waters of baptism.

The Holy Chrism

An oil that is mixed with a small amount of spice to dignify all who are anointed: a prayer that the Spirit keep faithful those who are called to God's service.

All:

Through anointing with this holy oil may those who are called to serve: the baptized, the confirmed and the ordained, know the gracious gift of God's Holy Spirit.

Presider:

The Lord is just in all his ways: and holy in all his works. (Ps 145: 17)




