



From the Desk of the Pastor

We celebrate the Fourth of July, Independence Day. In the 240 years since the signing of the Declaration of Independence we have much to be grateful for and much more to do.

Having won its independence, the newly formed United States of America moved forward into the uncharted waters of democracy, a government of the people and by the people. The Founders' idea of who "the people" were was limited to white, male property owners and yet, the resilience of the constitutional process slowly, often painfully, expanded the definition to include all of us, regardless of race, gender, religion, national origin. As a country, we have had to confront our history of bias, exclusion and even persecution of different individuals and classes of people who were deemed other, inferior, second class. We are getting better but still have a long way to go to be truly inclusive and accepting of each person.

In June, we celebrated Pride month and the strides made, especially locally, in recognizing the dignity of each person without regard to their sexual orientation, but the celebration does not gloss over the painful history of discrimination and the current reality of exclusion and prejudice.

This week, the Pastoral Council is sponsoring a Town Hall on Wednesday, July 7 at 7 p.m. to review the many initiatives we have undertaken to combat racism in our midst as a society and a Church and to re-commit ourselves to continue and sustain our efforts to further educate ourselves on aspects of racial inequality and commit to becoming an anti-racist community of faith. I encourage you to add your voice to our conversation and open your heart to the voices of others.

In the backdrop to all of our efforts, we share the grief of the members of the Indigenous Peoples mourning the discovery of the mass graves of children taken from their families in an ill-conceived plan to "assimilate them" into the predominant Eurocentric culture.

We celebrate the Fourth of July and we pray for our country and work with our fellow citizens to make this the home of the free-a place where all may grow to their full potential.

We will offer consecrated low-gluten hosts for our parishioners with celiac or wheat allergy conditions at every Mass from July 3-4. There are not free-gluten hosts. The low-gluten hosts contain less than 0.01% of gluten which is safe for most celiac diseases. But remember, even 0.01% of gluten can be critical for specific celiac diseases. Therefore, parishioners should consult with their physicians.

During the communion distribution, a Eucharist minister will stand in the big pillar on the Eastern side in front of the sanctuary distributing the consecrated low-gluten hosts.

The Church of St. Francis Xavier will begin a reflection on our communal racial justice ministry beginning Juneteenth, June 19, 2021. This will mark the one-year anniversary of our July 12, 2020 prayer service “*Action From Lamentation, Fury and Hope*” and our adoption of the Pledge for Racial Justice.



Our communal reflection will focus on (1) what we accomplished, what we fell short of accomplishing and how to integrate the year into the story of our community; (2) whether, and how, the principles set out in the Pledge for Racial Justice should be adapted to better reflect our uncompromising commitment to dismantling systemic racism; and, (3) how we shall re-affirm our commitment to achieving racial equity and justice by actions taken together with our marginalized sisters and brothers.

The first event will be a parish-wide town hall on **July 7, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. by Zoom**(link found at <https://sfxavier.org/2021/06/town-hall/>) . In addition, reflections, suggestions, questions and prayers may be submitted to pastoralcouncil@sfxavier.org. Ministries are encouraged to prepare a group response based upon the ministry’s experience of the past year. Individuals also are invited to contribute their personal thoughts. In response to requests from religious women working at the frontiers of the church on every continent, and also Church leaders in the Pan-Amazonian region, Pope Francis has established two different commissions to study the question of ordaining women to the diaconate. Discerning Deacons is an organization formed, in partnership with the School of Theology and Ministry at Boston College, to provide parishes throughout the country an opportunity to offer reflection, thoughts and feedback as a means of moving this endeavor forward. The meetings are designed to gather people’s real hopes, stories, prayers and concerns. We will share them with Discerning Deacons to be incorporated into a report that will be presented to Pope Francis and members of the Papal Commission before they meet this fall. A meeting will be held here at Xavier on **Sunday, July 11th at 1pm in the Main Church**. This meeting is open to all and is sponsored by the parish. 


