SEASON OF CREATION

The recent headlines have been strange: Rain bombs. Heat domes. Rain at Greenland's summit. (as opposed to snow). Artic heat of 100 degrees.

Flooding in Germany, China, and the recent flash flood in Tennessee, have almost let us forget the dry conditions that have contributed to catastrophic forest fires still burning in Greece, Turkey, and the West Coast of Canada and the U.S. and the decline of the Colorado River water system.

Our planet is heating up. Both the headlines and science tell us that. The U.N. scientific panel, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, IPCC, just released another alarming report.

"Climate chaos" is a term that has been used often. Now it's "climate emergency".

Our headline for this week is that on Sept. 1, thousands of Catholics and other Christians around the world will join together for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation and start the month-long Season of Creation for prayer and action.

This year's theme for the Season of Creation is "A Home for All? Renewing the oikos of God."

During this month, we can ask ourselves: Why is that question mark there? Who is being left out of the oikos (home) of God? Are they being excluded and not welcomed? What policies do we have for mitigation and resiliency for facing the impacts of climate change? For emergencies? Are resources equitably distributed? Will some suffer more than others? Do we care? What about the plant life and the animals that are also God's loving creation? We're not escaping to outer space, but do we have our own way of escaping from facing the reality of climate change?

Let's ask ourselves during this month: What can we do to renew our common home, the oikos of God? What can we do with our families, our parish, our city and nation - and even the world - to participate in God's creation process by protecting God's home and making it a flourishing and welcoming place for all.

In solidarity with the people of Haiti, struggling to recover from the double punch of the earthquake and the tropical storm, there will be a second collection this weekend. The proceeds will go to the Jesuits on the ground in Haiti. We will match whatever is collected.


