From the Desk of the Pastor

Many thanks to those who contributed to the special collection for relief in Haiti. We were able to send two thousand dollars to *Magis America*, an organization which sends the money directly to Jesuits and their colleagues on the ground in Haiti.

While we sympathize with the people in Louisiana and Mississippi and the devastation caused by hurricane Ida which also caused flooding in our area, we need to double down on our action on behalf of the environment. ***The Season of Creation*** is a six-week effort co-sponsored by our Environment Ministry to educate, demonstrate and lobby for effective action to halt the climate destruction caused by our misuse of creation. Please take the opportunity to participate in one or more of the offerings to increase your understanding of climate justice and how we impact our carbon footprint.

Next weekend we mark the twentieth anniversary of the terrorist attacks of 9/11 which directly touched the lives of many of us through the destruction of the World Trade Center and the loss of life immediately and as a result of the pollution from "the pile." Xavier High School is holding a special memorial mass on Friday, September 10 at 6 p.m. in the church. The New York Disaster Interfaith Services is sponsoring a Peace Walk on Thursday, September 9 from 5 to 7 and an Interfaith Prayer Service at the Salvation Army on Saturday September 11 from 9 to 1. There are details for registration elsewhere in the bulletin. We are also participating in the Pay it Forward effort organized, in part by parishioner Kevin Tuerff, author of *Come From Away*. The idea is to do three acts of random kindness on 9/11 to respond to terror with kindness. There is more information and suggested activities in the bulletin.

With this anniversary we also mark the official withdrawal from Afghanistan. While the pundits debate the pros and cons of the withdrawal and reflect on twenty years of American policy decisions by different administrations, we should continue to pray for peace and lasting justice in this complicated and broken world.



SEASON OF CREATION

In our faith tradition, we have a positive relationship with fire and water. We light the Easter Vigil fire every year to symbolize the light of the risen Christ. We immerse ourselves in water or pour water on the heads of our babies for baptisms, symbolizing a new life in Christ.

But these days of destructive fire and water should give us pause as we reflect on what is happening to God's oikos, the Greek word for home or shelter.

Drought conditions in the West have increased the wildfires which have now burned close to five million acres, an area almost the size of Connecticut. The warming ocean surface and atmosphere have brought intense rain and hurricane flooding to the east coast and gulf area.

We've had ample warning that global warming was happening. Yet we hesitate to confront it. The California drought motivated the governor to mandate fuel efficient and zero emission vehicles. We know that Prime Minister Modi of India held out on signing the Paris Accord on Climate until he saw photos of a major Indian city experiencing massive flooding.

Why do our leaders wait until disastrous floods and fires impact us to take necessary measures to stop climate change? Why are we not paying attention to the latest report from the IPCC warning us that the planet is warming at an alarming rate and saying that if we keep going with business as usual, we will pass critical thresholds that mean there's no turning back. No way to repair the harm we have done to God's oikos. And we will face more catastrophic events that completely destroy ecosystems and people's lives.

What part do we play in contributing to global warming with our life styles that directly or indirectly create the fossil fuel emissions that are warming our planet. How do our actions, as individuals, as a community, and as a nation impact our brothers and sisters in other communities and in the rest of the world.

And more importantly, how can we contribute to creating a flourishing oikos for all, as God intended, with fire and water being life-sustaining forces.


