## From the Desk of the Pastor

The new school year is in full swing, Broadway is reopening and the local streets are bustling with activity. There are many signs that life is coming back, if not the same as before, at least with the “new normal.”

I'm happy to report that more and more people are attending mass in person both on the weekend and during the week. Most ministries have plans to restart, some fully in person others with a blend. These are signs of our resilience individually and as a parish community. The pandemic of 1918, called the Spanish Flu, lasted until 1925 in some form or another and we have to expect that we will learn more letters of the Greek alphabet beyond delta, gamma and mu. Blessedly, our area has some of the highest vaccination rates in the country and the lowest hospitalization rates. With prudence and masks, we can continue to adapt to the Covid threat and resume life giving activities to help our spiritual, mental and physical health.

Even as we restart many activities, it is important to be mindful of those who are homebound or otherwise restricted because of the pandemic and their current health status. If you are aware of anyone who would like to have a pastoral visit from one of the staff or to have a eucharistic minister bring communion to them, please contact the parish office. Likewise, if you would like to assist in ministry to the homebound, please let us know.

As we have supported one another in prayer and presence for these last nineteen months, let us continue to do so.

## SEASON OF CREATION

The influx of migrants on our southern border is widely recognized as being fueled by poverty, violence, and impunity; but in the last five years, drought has played a major role in motivating people to leave and go north. The cropland of small farmers has dried up, creating the Central American Dry Corridor affecting 2.2 million people with food insecurity in Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador.

Many of those making the trek north are from campesino families whose dry fields no longer support their family's needs for food. Young sons in particular are encouraged to go north to earn money to send back to their families to buy food staples that they previously cultivated. We've seen these young men, some as young as 10 and 11, riding dangerously on top of trains. Increased food assistance is needed to stave off malnutrition and impoverishment. Advocacy to prevent drought is also urgently needed.

The warming of the planet is a global phenomenon. What we do in our daily lives and with our government policies has repercussions around the world. We don't have much time to prevent feedback loops from coming into play and causing more havoc on the climate and more cause for migration.

**Sept. 20 – 26** is *National Migration Week*, and Sept. 26 is World Day of Migrants and Refugees. We invite you to join Catholic Charities and the Sisters of Charity of NY for an interfaith prayer service on Sept. 26 at 2 pm EDT. Let's join in prayer for migrants and also advocate for more humane immigration policies and for policies that stem the warming of our planet.

You can start by calling your representatives to simply say you want strong action on climate (switchboard: 202-224-3121) and by signing the petition, "*Healthy Planet, Healthy People*", an appeal to the leaders of the UN Climate Summit which starts Oct. 31. Join your voice with other Catholics to raise our concern.
