From the Desk of the Pastor

This weekend we have a special appeal for the *Xavier Mission*. Cassandra Agredo, the Executive Director, will be speaking at each of the masses to describe the work of the Mission during this past year in light of the pandemic. I will not attempt to match her eloquence and zeal for the work of the Mission. Let me simply highlight the obvious: as result of the pandemic there has been an increase in homelessness, in mental illness and in food insecurity. While some of these issues require major government intervention to resolve the simple Gospel mandate to feed the hungry and clothe the naked requires us to meet the immediate needs of these, our neighbors, where they are.

Although the men's shelter has been closed because of Covid, the Welcome Table is still serving 600 to 700 meals on Sunday and families are coming to the food pantry and asking for clothing on a regular basis. Many are turning to the Mission to avoid eviction. Simply put: the need has never been greater. Please be generous today and consider supporting other fund-raising activities in support of the Mission moving forward. Thank you.

October 24th is World Mission Sunday. We have the annual collection in support of the Church's outreach in all parts of the world. In a world where humanitarian crises seem to erupt constantly, most often it is the local Catholic Church organizations which are in the forefront to meet the needs of the people of all faith traditions most effectively because there are pre-existing organizations on the ground in these parts of the world. This effort is most worthy of our support.

We are also blessed that weekend(October 24th) to have back, **Fr. Dan Corrou, S.J.** who will preside at the 11:30 mass and then host a presentation in the Mary Chapel on the work of **Jesuit Relief Services** especially in the Middle East. It's always great to welcome Dan back to Xavier. I ask you to consider how you can support both the efforts of the universal Church and the specific work of JRS. Thank you again.

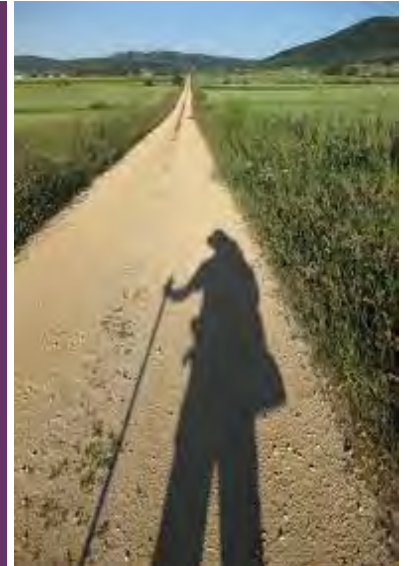

REMEMBER XAVIER IN YOUR ESTATE PLANNING

Over the years, the estate gifts received by Xavier have helped us continue to operate as a welcoming community and place of worship. October 18-24 is National Estate Planning Awareness Week. As Estate Planning Awareness week aims to teach us, an estate plan can help protect you, your loved ones, and your life's work. Estate planning is an often overlooked element of financial wellness, it is estimated that over half of Americans – 56% – do not have an up-to-date estate plan! It can also memorialize your medical wishes, especially important in this time of COVID, and ensure you have trusted people in place to help with financial or legal decisions. Everyone should have an estate plan in place to protect what you worked so hard for and so you can document the legacy you wish to leave behind for your family, your friends, and the charities you love. Already have a will or trust? Although a well-drawn will or trust provides for certain changes, professionals still advise that you review yours every three to five years. Events that should prompt a review include changes in your family situation, moving to a new state, changes in the value of your estate, changes in tax law, and changes in your charitable giving goals.
