# Reducing Plastic Waste in NY-A Step Forward

Single use plastics made from fossil fuels contribute to climate change and pollute our environment. While metals, glass and paper can be readily recycled, 95% of plastics are not recycled -- and most cannot be recycled at all. Our plastic waste, including from packaging, is landfilled, incinerated or becomes litter. Microplastic particles are now ubiquitous. Managing the waste stream is expensive - New York City spends \$426 million annually to export waste to landfills and incinerators.

There are two bills before the New York Senate and Assembly that would reduce our plastic waste: The Packaging Reduction and Recycling Infrastructure Act, which is designed to transform the way goods are packaged and sold in New York State; and the and the Bigger Better Bottle Bill, which would incentivize more bottle recycling. Plastic bottles are the most recyclable item in our plastic waste stream.

If enacted, the Packaging Reduction and Recycling Infrastructure Act would require most companies that sell products in New York to reduce their packaging by 50%, redesign their packaging for reusability or recycling, remove the most toxic chemicals within the plastic packaging, and pay for the waste management of their packaging. The Bigger Better Bottle Bill would increase the types of bottles that require deposits, and increase the deposit amount, which will lead to more bottles being recycled.


# Matt Phelps performing The People United Will Never Be Defeated by Frederic Rzewski
