Speaking up for the Earth, Our Common Home

"I ask everyone to accompany this pilgrimage of reconciliation with the world that is our home ... it is necessary to recognize that the most effective solutions will not come from individual efforts alone, but above all from major political decisions... "

-- Pope Francis, Laudate Deum, paragraph 69, issued October 4, 2023

The exhortation by Pope Francis in *Laudate Deum*, and before that in *Laudate Si*' (2015), calls on us, as people of faith, to address seriously the twin goals of care for the earth and care for the poor. The faith-based impetus to limit the climate change necessarily includes more than personal behavior changes. Pope Francis notes that personal behavior changes have value, but changes in policies and practices by governments, industries, businesses and organizations are needed.

St. Francis Xavier parish, as a Laudato Si' parish, along with the parish's Environment Ministry, is called to keep an eye on environmental developments and to use our voices to effect positive change. Two near-term opportunities to use our voices for our common home are lobbying days with our elected representatives in Albany -on Tuesday, January 23, and on Tuesday, February 27. These are opportunities to show support for important environmental policies.

In January, the focus is on the policies that will help NYS meet its climate targets and on energy justice with the NY Home Energy Affordable Transition Act (NY HEAT Act) that is part of the "People's Climate Justice Budget" outlined by NYRenews. In February, the focus is on two bills that have to do with plastic and producer responsibility: the Better Bottle Bill, and the Packaging Reduction and Recycling Infrastructure Act.

Future columns will provide more detail about participating in the lobbying process, whether in Albany, or locally, or from our homes. Whatever our resolution is, Pope Francis encourages us to "sing as we go" with "the joy of our hope."


