

From the Pastor's Desk Kenneth Boller, SJ

Today's second collection is for Catholic Relief Services. For seventy-five years, they have provided aid to migrants, those in war zones, victims of human trafficking and people in need throughout the world. Please be generous in support of their efforts.

Mark McManus: It made me feel connected to the reduction of plastic usage and my small role in helping that to come about. The process of speaking to our representatives made me feel like a participant in the democratic process rather than just an observer of it. Being in the room and with so many like-minded people gave me voice and inspiration to continue.

Steve Sandberg and The Art of the Piano

Three-time Emmy-nominated pianist/composer/raconteur Steve Sandberg plays classical masterpieces as well as original music that masterfully blends classical, global music traditions, and jazz with the excitement of virtuosic improvisation.

In his March 17 recital at St. Francis Xavier, Steve will perform a selection of his favorite classical compositions (several Chopin Mazurkas, plus pieces by Debussy, Ravel, Bach); his original compositions inspired by these masterpieces; and some 20th century jazz masterpieces by Billy Strayhorn, Chick Corea, and others. There will also be selections from Steve's "Dream Music Project," begun during the pandemic, in which Steve turns his listeners' dreams into music.

Are You Called to Serve on the Xavier Pastoral Council?

The Xavier Pastoral Council seeks one new member to join us beginning in September 2024. All members of the parish community are encouraged to prayerfully consider—in Ignatian language, to discern—whether this might be the time to offer your gifts as a servant leader. Serving in an advisory role to the pastor, the Council collaborates with the Xavier community to set parish goals and develop objectives; empowers parishioners to implement pastoral plans; and oversees and evaluates them in light of fulfillment of the parish mission.

- Pastoral Council members commit to a three-year term of service. At the conclusion of this term, they may serve a subsequent three-year term if they choose to do so. To be eligible, you must be a registered member of the parish for at least two years and be at least 20 years old.

Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross are a fourteen step or devotional, focusing on Jesus' last day on Earth as a human being, beginning with His condemnation to death by Pontius Pilate to His being laid in the tomb. The Stations are used as a mini-pilgrimage. imitating the Via Dolorosa, or Way of Sorrows, in Jerusalem to Mount Calvary. Tradition holds that the pilgrimage was initially followed by the Blessed Mother; though, the earliest mention of a Via Sacra, or Holy Way, was in the mid 15th Century, and permission was granted to erect Stations inside all churches in 1731 by Pope Clement XII. The Stations will be livestreamed on our Facebook. The Adoration of the Cross will take place before the Stations starting at 5:30 PM.


