

From the Pastor's Desk Kenneth Boller, SJ

The Palm Sunday liturgy is prayerful, inspiring, and engaging. The blessing of palms, proclamation of the gospel story of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem as well as our entrance procession allow us to be drawn into the events of this sacred week. The liturgy of Palm Sunday quickly moves from the exultation of the entrance into Jerusalem to the dramatic reading of the Passion. Allow your mind, body and soul to engage with the scriptures and be moved by the retelling of the stages of Jesus' passion.

On Monday, March 25, we will participate in Reconciliation Monday, a commitment by parishes in the Archdiocese of New York and the Dioceses of Brooklyn and Rockville Centre to offer the sacrament of reconciliation from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM. This is an excellent opportunity to receive the sacrament either here or at a church of your choosing.

I encourage you, if your schedule permits, to continue the journey through the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum, Holy Thursday at 7:30 PM, Good Friday at 3:00 PM and the Easter Vigil at 7:30 PM, when we will welcome into the Church our candidates from the R.C.I.A.

May this Holy Week be the occasion of blessing for you and yours.

Our Hosannas to God's Creation

On Palm Sunday, we recall Jesus' journey into Jerusalem with people shouting Hosanna! to praise Him as they laid palm leaves on the path before Jesus passes by.

What do we praise and honor with our "hosannas"?


Wealth? Social media hits? The newest tech gadgets? Flying around the world? Fast Fashion?

Pope Francis encourages us to make efforts in our households to "reduce pollution and waste, and to consume with prudence" thus "creating a new culture." (LD71) This means looking at our materialistic goals, especially if they involve consuming finite resources, polluting the air and water, or using materials that are exploitatively mined (e.g. cobalt for our batteries), or ultimately result in emissions that are warming our planet.

In Laudate Deum, Pope Francis points out that our lifestyles are not sustainable for the whole world to embrace: "If we consider that emissions per individual in the United States are about two times greater than those of individuals living in China, and about seven times greater than the average of the poorest countries, we can state that a broad change in the irresponsible lifestyle connected with the Western model would have a significant longterm impact." (LD72)



This Holy Week, look back on your Lenten practices. Were there any related to the environment or to reducing emissions? Are they practices you can continue beyond Lent by making them a daily life habit? We say "Hosanna" to your new creation care habits as we participate together in building God's Kindom!!

Are You Called to Serve on the Xavier Pastoral Council?

The Xavier Pastoral Council seeks **three** new members to join us beginning in September 2024. All members of the parish community are encouraged to prayerfully consider—in Ignatian language, to *discern*—whether this might be the time to offer your gifts as a servant leader. Serving in an advisory role to the pastor, the Council collaborates with the Xavier community to set parish goals and develop objectives; empowers parishioners to implement pastoral plans; and oversees and evaluates them in light of fulfillment of the parish mission.

• Pastoral Council members commit to a threeyear term of service. At the conclusion of this term, they may serve a subsequent three-year term if they choose to do so. *To be eligible, you must be a registered member of the parish for at least two years and be at least 20 years old.*
