

From the Pastor's Desk Kenneth Boller, SJ

I met Phil on a Sunday afternoon in April 2018 while attending a "Returning Catholics?" meeting at Xavier. As I was wrestling with that question and searching for a faith community after many years of journeying alone, Phil told me about Gay Catholics with a warm smile. Having been raised Catholic in Spain and having come out as a gay man late and painfully. I had always thought that being gav and Catholic were mutually exclusive. But I joined one of their meetings, and met John, Ed and many other wonderful companions who have since then shown me that gays can be truly Catholic without having to throw out our true selves at the door. Not long after that first meeting I was marching on Pride Day under the Xavier banner along with many parish siblings - I was walking on the streets of NYC as both openly gay and a returned Catholic!

GAY CATHOLICS is primarily a gay men's group but all are welcome to attend our meetings and events. We generally meet in-person every first Friday of the month and virtually every third Friday to pray, reflect, celebrate and support each other. Mindful of the injustices against the LGBTQ+ people still to be challenged within and outside the Church, we look with gratitude to the generations before us and with hope to the future, aware that our commitment to building a fully inclusive Church today is as relevant and urgent as ever.

SFX Submits Its Report to the Global Synod

Xavier has submitted its latest report to the Global Synod on Synodality. In this phase of the Synod, parishes around the world were asked to consider "How can we be a synodal Church in mission?" and to root our responses in the light of our own "situation, character and experience, sharing good practices." Our report was written by the lay-led Xavier Synod Committee based upon small spiritual conversations held with nearly 100 parishioners and staff over the past few months.

THIS IS ALEX'S STORY.



Alex* was unable to work for several months because of a health condition. Behind in rent on the home he shares with his wife, his landlord sent an eviction notice. Xavier Mission provided \$2,000 toward Alex's back rent.

Alex has since secured gainful employment and he and his wife are now stable in their home.

Our Eviction Prevention Program is funded entirely by private donations.

In the first six months of this fiscal year, we assisted 65 families. Unfortunately, our program has been closed to the public since February due to lack of funding.
