### From the Pastor's Desk Kenneth Boller, SJ

In our Gospel today, Jesus tells the disciples and us, as well, that the commandment to love one another is given to us so that Jesus' joy may be in us and our joy may be compete.

Joy is not a concept we deal with very much. We may strive for happiness or, at least, contentedness in the activities we pursue in our lives, but joy is something different. One of the definitions of joy is "the emotion evoked by the prospect of possessing what one desires."

For St. Ignatius Loyola, the goal of discernment was the "id quod volo," "that which I truly desire." In other words, looking deeply into our hearts and finding our deepest desires. Ignatius knew that is where we would find God, in our deepest, truest desires. The joy which Jesus speaks of in the Gospel comes from an undivided heart, totally united to God.

Having this inner joy doesn't make us immune from life's trials and even tragedies. Rather, it anchors us to deal with whatever life deals us and gives us the serenity to face adversity head on.

These days we hear so much about rage as a motivating factor especially in violent confrontations. Rage is exactly the opposite of joy. It feeds on our unmet expectations and our sense of lost entitlements.

Joy gives life and hope. Rage consumes us and others.

Jesus wants us to share His joy so that our joy may be complete.

## The Seeds of Hope Are Sprouting

May 19 is Pentecost and also the beginning of Laudato Si' Week, from May 19 -26, celebrating the ninth anniversary of the Laudato Si' encyclical.

A year ago at Pentecost, we adopted our parish's Laudato Si' Action Platform (LSAP) plan. So we can celebrate the sprouting of that plan, symbolized by new leaves on the trees planted a year ago in the front of the church, and the way that different ministries have incorporated care of creation into their work. The recent Brunch Ministry meal was a great example.



"Seeds of Hope" is the theme for Laudato Si' Week, which is sponsored by the Vatican's Dicastery for Human Development and facilitated by the Laudato Si' Movement. There is a reflection program for each day of the week, which we can pray together as a parish.www.laudatosiweek.org

During that week, on Monday, May 20, at 7 pm, the SFX LSAP team will offer an event on sustainable investing to suggest ways to ensure that our hardearned savings are not invested in destructive fossil fuel industries, but rather in a sustainable future for the next generations. #### Moving into the Holy: Dance, Movement, and Posture in Worship with Luz Marina Díaz, PhD Sunday, May 5 | 1:00 PM Main Church & Online

As part of the National Eucharistic Revival, the Church of St. Francis Xavier will host lectures on the Eucharist. We continue with Luz Marina Díaz's lecture on *Moving into the Holy: Dance, Movement, and Posture in Worship.* This lecture will explore a brief history of dance in worship, a rationale for incorporating dance in worship, and guidance for understanding various movement types and prayer postures in our liturgies.

Throughout the Mass, the priest takes the time to explain essential elements of each part of the celebration, including the Introductory Rites, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, and Concluding Rites, as well as relevant liturgical-related information such as liturgical year, liturgical colors, and vestments.

In this final section, the author reflects on the impact of enslavement, Jim Crow, and current attitudes towards the concept of race on his own family's history.


