### Taking Stock of Creation Care at Mid-Year

"If present trends continue, this century may well witness extraordinary climate change,... with serious consequences for all of us." (LS 24)

At year's midpoint, let's take stock.

Starting with the spiritual, our Laudato Si Anniversary on-line prayer service (May 22) expressed gratitude for Creation, recognized our interconnectedness, and implored guidance for how best to care for creation and to blunt the climate crisis with social justice in mind. Let these be our ongoing prayers and intentions.

The May 20th program "Responsible Investment for a Sustainable Future" was in keeping with the economic goal of the parish's Laudato Si' Action Platform plan. The recording remains available on YouTube on the SFXChurchNYC channel. Following on that, we provided information for green or fossilfree banking and credit cards in a recent Creation Care Corner.

Regarding advocacy, the parish supported two New York State bills regarding plastic in packaging, and bottles in the waste stream, as well as a social justice bill regarding heating. These "got close" but were not enacted in this session. On the positive side, a major New York bill to generate fees from fossil fuel companies did pass in the two chambers and is waiting the governor's signature. The fees will be used for mitigation and resiliency measures in low-income communities and communities of color that face the more severe impacts of climate change.

Upcoming, the Environment Ministry will sponsor two films over the summer, and is making plans for the parish to celebrate the Season of Creation in the fall. Because the environmental problems are getting more serious, we can expect to engage in more advocacy.

Give us grace, O God, to not lose heart, and continue caring for Creation and the poor!

### LGBTQ+ Pride Month Testimonials

Ninety eight years ago, I was born with 2 pre-existing conditions. I was CATHOLIC and I was Gay. In my growing up years, Gay persons were more often labeled "queer, homo, pansy, sissies, etc.



The Legal Establishment criminalized us; the Mental Health professions Psychiatry, and including my own, Psychology, diagnosed and treated us as "Mentally Ill" and "Emotionally Disturbed." Our Catholic Church called our love a sin and called us "Intrinsically Disordered."

Under such conditions, it was not always easy to be a trusting and open person. Survival often depended on disguise and deception.

In the late 1990's, I vividly remember watching the NYC Pride March on a hot Sunday in June. I saw a most unexpected marching group of joyful men and women of all ages proudly carrying a very large banner saying "The Church of St. Francis Xavier. A Roman Catholic Parish" with other signs saying "ALL ARE WELCOME" and "GOD CREATED ME"

What a heartfelt display of a loving community of people, I thought.

With my skepticism intact, a few Sundays later, I attended mass expecting to find myself greeted at entry with the usual "All are welcome"; but expecting to find inside "Don't Ask ...Don'tTell." I have never been so happy to be wrong! And through the decades I that message has been consistent in this parish. I have been humbled by the message of "You belong here or "Welcome home!"

At SFX each person is respected and not judged as they venture on their personal journey. It is a place where questioning, critical thinking, and primacy of conscience are highly valued. This is supported by a caring community where all are recognized and affirmed. It is also a place to enjoy oneself in the company of other spiritual journeyers and also be of service to others through one of the many ministries dedicated to the Gospel of Social Justice.

Although I now live in Upper NY State, SFX still very much continues to be family to me. That will never change.





### COMING SOON: PHASE 2 OF ART PROJECT





In 2020, in the wake of George Floyd's murder, the Church of St. Francis Xavier joined faith communities across the country in reflecting on myriad aspects of racial justice that the Gospel calls us to address. The reflection continued the parish's modern-day commitment to racial justice and inclusion which dates to at least 1960 when the parish had an annual civil rights

Mass in the name of St. Martin de Porres.

The second phase of the project is underway—the design and fabrication of two tapestries for the narthex, one on each side of the steps leading into the church. The subtitle of the banner is a quote is based on Psalm 43:4, "I will go to the altar of God...To God who gives joy to my youth."

The highly regarded artist, John Nava, who created the tapestries for the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels in Los Angeles, accepted a commission to create the tapestries. We hope to install the tapestries in late July and will celebrate them on Sunday, September 15.
