## **Voting Our Values**

Voting is an "opportunity to contribute to our nation and promote the common good by bringing the values and teaching of our faith to bear on the issues facing our society."

Our Sunday Visitor's "Guide to Catholic Voting", 2016.

Among the great issues facing us today is how we care for our common earthly home and one another amidst the climate crisis. So, voting is essential, and voting informed by our faith-based values is vital.

We note that no candidate or platform fully comports with Catholic social teaching, so discernment about who to vote for is essential.

#### **Key questions to ask include:**

- Do the plans and platforms of the candidates and / or their political party, if implemented, lead to improved care for our common home and to life-sustaining measures for our communities?
- Would existing policies that currently have a negative or positive effect be changed?
- Would fossil fuels continue to be subsidized?
- Would the current transition to renewable energy and to regenerative agricultural practices be helped or hindered?


Following are two non-partisan organizations that focus on these questions:

#### The League of Conservation Voters

(www.lcv.org) advocates for sound environmental laws and policies, holds elected officials accountable, and seeks to elect pro-environment candidates. The LCV has chapters in 30 states, including New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, and Pennsylvania.

The Environmental Voter Project (www. environmentalvoter.org) helps mobilize millions of environmentalists who generally do not vote in great numbers. EVP uses data analytics and behavioral science to launch targeted postcard campaigns and phone banking from any state. Both organizations can use volunteers. #### Art Project Phase 2: Modern Day Holy People and Saints of the Americas



In 2020, in the wake of George Floyd's murder, the Church of St. Francis Xavier joined faith communities across the country in reflecting on myriad aspects of racial justice that the Gospel calls us to address. The reflection continued the parish's modern-day commitment to racial justice and inclusion which dates to at least 1960 when the parish had an annual civil rights Mass in the name of St. Martin de Porres.

The second phase of the project is underway—the design and fabrication of two tapestries for the narthex, one on each side of the steps leading into the church. The subtitle of the banner is a quote is based on Psalm 43:4, "I will go to the altar of God...To God who gives joy to my youth."

The highly regarded artist, John Nava, who created the tapestries for the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels in Los Angeles, accepted a commission to create the tapestries. We hope to install the tapestries in late July and will celebrate them on Sunday, September 15.

### Center for Migration Studies 2024 Immigration Integration Convening Thursday, September 12

On Thursday, September 12, 2024, the Center for Migration Studies of New York (CMS) will host a 2024 Immigrant Integration Convening, A Church at the Borders: Best Practices, Promises and Aspirations for the Integration of Migrants in New York, to be held at St. John's University in New York City.

The arrival of over 190,000 asylum-seekers to the New York area over the past two years has brought into focus what it means to be a welcoming city, and especially, "What does welcome and integration mean for the Church today?" Certain parishes and universities, legal and social services have made great strides, but emerging "best practices" have neither been identified nor shared widely. The convening will shed light on the integration of migrants within all the organizations and institutions of the Church in the area, and show, in many places, how migrants are leading the way.

The conference fee is \$85, which includes meals during the conference program. Discounted rates are available for parishes and parish ministries. Students, St. John's staff and faculty, as well as conference moderators and speakers, may attend the conference free of charge. Discounts and fee waivers are available for those indicating financial need.

FAQS: HOW TO HELP NEIGHBORS FACING HUNGER, HOMELESSNESS, AND POVERTY.

#### WHAT SHOULD I DO IF...

I want to help an unhoused person I see every day, or who is sleeping in front of my home? If you feel the situation is safe, ask the person if they need assistance and if you can help in finding information for them. Xavier Mission provides street sheets and Get Help cards that you can give out to anyone in need.

#### WHAT SHOULD I DO IF...

I see a unhoused person being told to leave a subway, park, or other public space by police or others?

Without becoming intrusive, note the officer's badge number and record the situation, if safe. Then report the incident to the Legal Aid Society at legalaidnyc.org.

#### WHAT SHOULD I DO IF...

Someone on the subway or on the street asks me for money or food?

We suggest keeping granola bars and/or info sheets in your bag to give in those situations. Make sure to ask if the person would like what you have before you hand it to them, so that they have the option to say no. However, always assess the situation for safety and only do what you are comfortable with.
