Disability Pride Month

Sr. Thea Bowman teaches us about the disability justice principle of *presumed competency*. A simple definition is this: assume everyone is competent. Near the end of Sr. Thea's life, she was diagnosed with metastatic breast cancer, a terminal diagnosis. She had the opportunity to speak to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops in 1989. At the time, her health was in decline, and she was encouraged to skip the event. She was in a wheelchair, and the stage was not accessible to her.

She showed the bishops, and everyone, that she was perfectly capable of being a prophet, no matter how her body functioned. Since her untimely death less than a year later, there has been excitement to canonize her. She is included in The Saintly Six, an effort to canonize six African-American prophets.

During Disability Pride Month, we celebrate the fact that all people are truly equal members of society. We celebrate the ability to live fully in our bodies and minds. We beg society – and the Catholic Church – to treat people with disabilities as equals. One of people with disabilities' most common traits is the ability to *figure things out*. We negotiate a world that is not quite built for us. We find our own accommodations when others claim it can't be done. We speak up in whatever voice we have – typical, garbled, sign language, song, electronic – we have so much to say. We need more people to listen.

How can we at Xavier celebrate all people more wholly? First, presume competency. If a person reaches out for a bulletin, don't withhold one under the assumption that they can't read it. Don't insist people with disabilities sit in one location in the church. Offer help if you wish, but if someone says no, honor their preference. Listen. Include people with disabilities in meetings – even if it's difficult to understand them, or if they require accommodations. Don't discourage people from participating, based on your perception of their limitations – this can sting. In a parish, when discrimination occurs, it can feel like God is not fully present. We should invite all of God to every part of parish life. We've had some wins, but there's a lot yet to be done.

Coming Soon! Art Project Phase 2 Modern Day Holy People and Saints of the Americas





In 2020, in the wake of George Floyd's murder, the Church of St. Francis Xavier joined faith communities across the country in reflecting on myriad aspects of racial justice that the Gospel calls us to address. The reflection continued the parish's modern-day commitment to racial justice and inclusion which dates to at least 1960 when the parish had an annual civil rights Mass in the name of St. Martin de Porres.


The second phase of the project is underway—the design and fabrication of two tapestries for the narthex, one on each side of the steps leading into the church. The subtitle of the banner is a quote is based on Psalm 43:4, "I will go to the altar of God...To God who gives joy to my youth."

The highly regarded artist, John Nava, who created the tapestries for the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels in Los Angeles, accepted a commission to create the tapestries. We hope to install the tapestries in late July and will celebrate them on Sunday, September 15.
