# From the Pastor's Desk Kenneth Boller, SJ

World leaders have been gathering at the United Nations this week against the background of the last week of the Season of Creation and the escalation of hostilities in the Middle East, Ukraine and Sudan, among other places. We hope and pray that, beyond the public speeches, active diplomacy may take place to bring peace with justice to the peoples of these lands.

These days we are particularly conscious of the increased bombing in Lebanon. As of this writing, Fr. Dan Corrou, SJ reports that Jesuit Refugee Service has had to suspend its operations in Beirut and withdrawn all personnel to safety. If you wish to support the works of JRS, Dan writes:

#### Caring for Creation with Your Transportation Choices

In this 4th week of the Season of Creation, we'll look at how we might hope and act with Creation in the area of transportation, which is the largest source, 28%, of U.S. greenhouse gas emissions. How we get from one place to another matters. Let's walk when we can, bike if we can. Using public transportation and ride-sharing are positive options. Purchasing an electric vehicle is a huge positive step, especially if the electricity is from renewable sources. Hybrid cars and good-mileage cars help. Cutting back on one flying will help. All count towards caring for our common home. The less reliant on fossil fuels, the better for the climate.

It's hopeful to know that the transition away from gas-powered vehicles is happening. The infrastructure law is providing funds for more charging stations. Phasing out gas-powered engines on trucks, which represent 4% of all vehicles, but 40% of all road transportation emissions, will have a big impact. Some experts think it's possible that buses will be electric by 2030 and trucks by 2040.

What can we do? Support regulations that set emission standards, like those of the European Union and California. The Earth Act to Prevent Climate Pollution (aka the Earth Bill), introduced by New York Congressmember Adriano Espaillat, includes a section on transportation that incentivizes vehicle makers to speed up this transition.

Batteries are still an issue. The mining of lithium for the batteries used in EVs produces toxic waste. The batteries also require nickel, cobalt and manganese. A new strategy is to reuse and recycle these key components. The infrastructure law supports companies recovering over 90% of these materials. Researchers are working on batteries that use alternative components.

As the Union of Concerned Scientists publication says, electric vehicles are charging ahead! And that gives us hope.


