# From the Pastor's Desk Kenneth Boller, SJ

The Scripture readings for this Sunday are intended to celebrate the new creation inaugurated by the arrival of the Messiah, the Chosen One. In this new creation everyone has achieved an integrity of mind, body and soul as they are welcomed into the reign of God.

While we certainly desire wholeness and integrity for all, these readings expose a persistent belief that people with disabilities are punished by God for the sins of their ancestors. This belief leads to a harmful mindset that labels individuals with disabilities as "other" or "less than"—a belief still perpetuated, entrenched, and pervasive today—contradicting the Gospel's core values of love, acceptance, and inclusion, particularly for the most vulnerable, and constituting an affront to Jesus' teachings at the very heart of the Gospel.

Last month, the world was captivated by the remarkable athletic achievements on display during the Olympic Games in Paris. Now, just a few weeks later, the Paralympics are showcasing the incredible athletic talents of people with disabilities, demonstrating that ability exists on a spectrum and challenging us to rethink our assumptions about what it means to be able.

Inspired by the Letter of James, we are called to confront our own shortcomings and those of the members of our community in creating a truly welcoming and inclusive environment for all. We acknowledge that our efforts have often been incomplete, often lacking, and inadvertently perpetuating harmful exclusions. We must do better and commit to actively dismantling barriers and biases, embracing all people—regardless of ability, race, gender, sexual orientation, or social status—as beloved children of God. Our faith demands nothing less!


human suffering as well as the suffering of all our fellow creatures.
