From the Pastor's Desk Kenneth Boller, SJ

In the past week we concluded the month-long *Season of Creation* with the backdrop of devastating hurricanes in the southeastern part of the country. We also observed the one-year anniversary of the war in Gaza which seems to be expanding rather than shrinking.

These events and so many others around the world can render us numb; make us feel powerless. Our first reading today reminds us: "I prayed, and prudence was given me; I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me. I preferred her to scepter and throne."

We need true prudence and wisdom to navigate these times and not lose heart. Let us pray that the leaders of the world will seek wisdom to find just and equitable solutions to the many conflicts which count civilians, especially women and children as "collateral damage."

For our part, the Gospel challenges us to go beyond the basics of the commandments to become followers of Jesus. What am I called to do? Will I follow or walk away?

Learning from Indigenous Wisdom

This weekend, we celebrate Indigenous People's Day, juxtaposed to Columbus Day. The renaming of the holiday serves to recognize Columbus' maltreatment of the indigenous people he encountered and the tragic impact that settler colonialism had on the indigenous population.

In general, the environmental movement honors the knowledge and wisdom carried through the centuries by indigenous people living close to the land, using from nature only what they need, and sharing the bounty of the earth collectively.

Some social justice movements now start their programs with a land acknowledgement to 1) recognize that the land they are on was forcibly seized from an indigenous group, and 2) express solidarity with Indigenous Peoples.

New York City, original home of the Lenape, Rockaway and Canarsie peoples, has one of the largest urban populations of indigenous people in the country. The Shinnecock Nation on eastern Long Island is widely known for its annual Pow-Wow. Less known is the Shinnecock's project to grow seaweed as a food source and also a strategy to address climate change because seaweed absorbs carbon dioxide and mitigates ocean acidification.

Indigenous cultural traditions of dancing and drumming reflect an earth-care world view. Mario Cortés, a Nahua indigenous migrant from Mexico and a traditional dancer, says, "Our circle and its dances represent the circle of life and all that is found on Mother Earth."

Robin Wall Kimmerer, a botanist and Indigenous author of *Braiding Sweetgrass*, brings together indigenous wisdom of nature with science, and puts into writing what the Indigenous environmentalist Oren Lyons describes as "the spiritual relationship that Chief Seattle called the 'web of life... the interrelationships that bind all living things together."

This weekend, from noon on Sunday, Oct. 13, to noon on Monday, Oct. 14, you can celebrate Indigenous culture on Randall's Island at the 10th Annual Gathering and Celebration "We Are Here, Still." There will be music, song, dance, food, a sunrise ceremony and prayer, and a chance to hear indigenous activists.
