

Thoughts on Music and Eucharist by John Uehlein

Why do we sing at communion? What do we sing at communion? And How do we sing at communion. Although I may quote the instructions from Rome a little, most of what I have to say, here, and at the presentation next Sunday at 1PM as part of the Eucharistic Revival is personal faith sharing based on my experiences since I was a 16 year old folk guitarist appointed to the newly formed Diocesan Liturgical Commission. I am not an academic. But to start with a quote from the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), stated simply as to WHY we sing at Communion, "86. While the Priest is receiving the Sacrament, the Communion Chant is begun, its purpose being to express the spiritual union of the communicants by means of the unity of their voices, to show gladness of heart, and to bring out more clearly the "communitarian" character of the procession to receive the Eucharist." Mother Church instructs us to sing for the most obvious reason: Singing together is one of the most ancient practices drawing people into oneness with themselves and their environment. However, the practice of private communion with Jesus is so common in Liturgies these days that we have almost fallen into those that sings during communion and those that don't. I'd like to suggest a both/and paradigm

Leading us to the second question: "What do we sing at Communion?" The documents mention over and over the word Antiphon which by definition is a single sentence set to music usually sung in alteration with the cantor or choir singing the verses. This is ideal for the WHAT we sing at communion as it doesn't require holding a song sheet and reading words, it merely requires *listening, a most unique spiritual practice*. There are many beautiful Eucharistic hymns that are NOT ideal for communion because they contain four freely written out verses with many words. These hymns work well at the Preparation of the Gifts. The paradigm I'm suggesting is one where the communicant freely travels between private prayer and communal singing as moved by the Spirit. The Importance of Singing, the how of what we sing is the sign of the heart's joy (cf. Acts 2:46). Thus St. Augustine says rightly, "Singing is for one who loves,"[48] and there is also an ancient proverb: "Whoever sings well prays twice over." Come join us for a Eucharistic sing-along next Sunday at 1PM in the church.

Raising our voice for our values



We close the Season of Creation with the theme of advocacy. We participate in advocacy actions to have our point of view expressed, considered, and hopefully taken into account, rather than letting others decide for us about policies that affect our lives and the common good.

We tend to think of advocacy as "being political"; but allowing others to be our voice by our silence is also being pollical. Advocacy actions are ways of directing policies to be in line with our values of faith, peace and justice...the bedrocks of Catholic Social Teaching.

In all of these advocacy actions, we raise our voices as people of faith.

To hope and act with creation calls us to step out of our comfort zone at times to express our values as people of faith on matters that we care about, matters that impact the well-being of our brothers and sisters and future generations and our common home. Giving witness and raising our voices together as a community gives us hope.
