## From the Pastor's Desk Kenneth Boller, SJ

Are you generous? Do you trust in God's providence?

These questions emerge from a reading of the Book of Kings and the Gospel today. It's not a matter of money or resources as much as a lived attitude. The widow of Zarephath was caught between the customs of hospitality and the reality of not having enough food for herself and her son. At the word of the prophet of a God she did not follow, she shared what she had and lived on it for a year. The "widow's mite" is given as a faith offering to God without conditions.

As I write this on Wednesday morning, as we absorb the results of the election. It has been clear for some time that our country has been almost evenly divided which means about half of the country was disappointed with the final choice. The spirit of the gospel requires a generous attitude and renewed trust in God's power in our lives.

Trusting in God's providence, we continue to give witness to gospel values especially when they don't seem to be popular. Let us remember the Prayer of St. Theresa:

Let nothing disturb you, Let nothing frighten you, All things pass away: God never changes. Patience obtains all things. He who has God Finds he lacks nothing; God alone suffices.

### Supporting Jesuits Apostolates in Beirut

Fr. Dan Corrou, the former pastor of St. Francis Xavier, lives and works in Lebanon. He recently provided an update on his work in a presentation sponsored by Canadian Jesuits International. This Sunday's second collection will be sent to Fr. Dan in Beirut to support the work of the Jesuits and their lay companions responding to the needs of the migrant communities in Beirut and the people who have been displaced as a result of the conflict. One of Fr. Dan's many responsibilities is pastor of St. Joseph Parish, a part of the Arrupe Migrant Center in Beirut. The parish is the spiritual home for migrant workers largely from Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Sudan and several other countries. The migrant workers are uniquely impacted by the escalation of the war in the Middle East.

## A Catholic Voice at Three Global Conferences

While we have been focusing on our national elections, three global UN Summits having to do with the environment have happened or are scheduled to happen in November.

The UN Conference on Biodiversity, COP 16,

has already taken place in Cali, Colombia, to continue the efforts to protect plant and animal life and entire biosystems and communities that depend on them.

The conference did come up with some positive outcomes: 1) Progress in defining priority areas for the conservation of marine and coastal areas, and 2) a decision to allow direct input from indigenous communities without having them go through country representatives. Yet, here was no agreement on financing for biodiversity protection and the conference had twice as many corporate representatives as last year.

**The UN Climate Summit, COP 29,** will run from Nov. 11 to 22 in Baku, Azerbaijan, where again corporate interests, especially of fossil fuel companies, are expected to dominate this space. The focus will be on financing for climate mitigation and on the clarification of markets for carbon offsets. The goal is to keep global temperature below 1.5 degrees Celsius (2.7 F.) and definitely less than a 2-degree C. increase. Dramatic action is needed.

**The UN Plastics Treaty** will hold its last meeting from Nov. 25 to Dec. 1 in Busan, Republic of Korea. The goal for this series of five meetings has been to craft a legally binding agreement on plastic pollution. Given that plastic is made from fossil fuels, the producers of oil and natural gas have had a dominant presence and prevented progress.

Faith groups have also had an increasing presence in these discussions. The Vatican and the Laudato Si' Movement are among the groups representing a Catholic Voice at these summits. In them we place our hope and our prayers.
