From the Pastor's Desk Kenneth Boller, SJ

Back in my seminary days, there was a gruff old Jesuit (or so he seemed to us twenty-year-olds) who read the first line of today's letter to the Philippians as the entrance antiphon:

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I say it again, rejoice." He barked it at the congregation.

The dissonance between his tone and the meaning of the words was striking—and comical to us in the seminary.

We may feel a similar dissonance in our own lives, especially amid the darkness of the events surrounding us these days and the hope we hold for Christmas. Yet, we are called to rejoice. We are called to acknowledge the presence of our God in our midst, even in the depths of darkness and turmoil.

As we continue our Christmas preparations, let us remember that the light of God's love shines ever deeper in our lives, calling us to share that love with others, just as the Gospel reminds us today.



Guardianship, not Greed – an Advent Hope

Observing the global environmental and climate crises, Pope Francis, in both Laudato Si' (2015) and Laudate Deum (2023) called for an "ecological conversion" and an "integral ecology." These calls are multifaceted -- to care for the earth and to care for the poor, and to recognize and honor, via our actions, the interconnectedness among us humans and with all Creation.

This recognition involves both mental and spiritual assent and is core to "ecological conversion." Such a conversion involves a change of attitude away from "dominion" or "domination" of nature, which is often driven by greed or power-seeking and ignores adverse side effects on people and Creation. While "steward-ship" is a better formulation than "domination," and implies thoughtful care and management, "guardian-ship" seems even better.

An example of this concept is the indigenous Filipino community that Fr. Pedro Walpole SJ, our speaker last week, works with in the Philippines. The community considers that they have always been guardians of the land and forests. Corporate interests have imposed themselves with dominion and domination based on greed, and are seizing and deforesting the land.

With long-term sustainability in mind, guardians act for the current and future generations of people and creatures. Guardians inform and train the younger generations to keep it going. Guardians recognize current needs without ruining the future and know and act when enough is enough. Guardianship counteracts greed and exploitation.

This Advent, let us pray for and seek the guardianship of our earth that is so needed. Let's start with ourselves, and, by example in word and deed, carry it forward.
