A Letter from Xavier Mission Cassandra Agredo, Executive Director

Dear Friends,

Many of you may have noticed that the fridge and cupboard outside the 15th St. entrance are no longer there. We know this may feel sudden and possibly even unkind, especially during winter and the holidays, but this decision was not made lightly.

The Chelsea Fridge was never a program run by Xavier Mission or the church. In 2020, during COVID, local residents proposed opening a mutual-aid community fridge, and we agreed to provide space and the necessary modifications. From the start, the agreement was that community volunteers would operate and maintain the fridge.

For years, a strong network of volunteers managed the fridge, ensuring regular pickups, cleaning, and addressing neighborhood concerns. Over time, this network dwindled, leaving no one to take the lead. Maintenance responsibilities increasingly fell to Xavier Mission's small, part-time staff, whose focus must remain on our primary programs.

Without consistent upkeep, the fridge area became a source of fines for improper garbage disposal and a serious pest problem. This posed a risk to our soup kitchen, food pantry, and the high school cafeteria, which share the space. Despite efforts to re-engage volunteers, the situation worsened, forcing us to close the fridge to protect our existing programs and maintain a safe, hygienic facility.

We regret this deeply but had no other choice. We've shared resources for alternative food programs and assisted guests in finding help. Additionally, we've searched for a new location for several months without success but will continue to look. Community support is critical for finding a site and ensuring its sustainability.
