

Reflection from Fr. Ben Hawley, SJ

Our community celebration of World AIDS Day last Monday evening reminded many of those present of a great existential question: Why me? Why was I spared when so many I knew and loved died? Why me? when so many fall prey to HIV/AIDS today around the world?

This great question - Why me? – can confront us in any of a number of circumstances: a serious diagnosis, a job terminated, a significant relationship ended, a home destroyed by fire or storm. The question comes to us either as one spared or as one affected.

There is no answer to the question. What has happened is a brute fact that withstands rational explanation. We are left with the choice of falling into cynicism ("Why me? I am always the victim!") or rage ("Why this? It must be their fault!" whoever "they" may be). Or we might embrace a deeper humility before God and cry "Help!!"

When crisis strikes, our Catholic faith encourages us to cry "Help!!", to find a way, difficult as it is, to accept the situation for what it is: "I am powerless in this situation." From that admission we can then reaffirm our belief that a power greater than ourselves can restore us to sanity; and then we can decide to turn our lives over to the care and concern of God. Our hope is that God will help make a way out of no-way. Our trust is that the Crucified Jesus will help us through this suffering to find him Risen in our lives as we find a way forward toward our own rising.

With so much turmoil in our world, we might in this Advent season desire yet more deeply Jesus' coming into the turmoil. We might quote with renewed fervor the final lines of the Book of Revelation: "Come, Lord Jesus!"

Jesus is here. The Kingdom is here, but not yet. In this Advent season we might pledge to help make the Kingdom visibly present in our words, our deeds, and our prayers.


