Our Year of Hope

On Christmas Eve, Pope Francis opened the doors to the **2025 Jubilee Year of Hope.** A Jubilee year, usually every 25 years, encourages us to seek a right relationship with God, with our neighbors and with the earth, and involved the forgiveness of debts, the return of misappropriated land, and a fallow period for the fields. In keeping with the Jubilee Year of Hope, let's start 2025 with at least one environmental resolution that inspires hope.

2025 is also the 10th Anniversary of the encyclical Laudato Si', and we will be celebrating the encyclical, engaging in advocacy, and encouraging daily practices that help restore a right relationship with nature.

Just as this Jubilee Year started, we had a New York moment of joy and hope when we learned that the day after Christmas and the first day of Hanukkah, Governor Hochul signed one of the most significant bills on climate change in the country. The bill, referred to as the "superfund" or "polluter pays" bill, requires the oil companies most responsible for climate-warming emissions to pay the state \$75 billion over 25 years - \$3B a year – as restitution for the effects of climate change by creating a Climate Change Adaptation Cost Recovery Program. It is a restorative bill.

The bill had been approved by both the NY Senate and Assembly, but the governor waited until December 26, just a few days before the year-end deadline, to sign it.

Why did she finally sign? Advocacy. Pressure from legislators. Pressure from environmental activists who peacefully engaged in rallies around the Christmas tree inside the NY State Capitol building. Let's make this Jubilee Year one of hope for our future generations with our actions.
