From the Pastor's Desk Kenneth Boller, SJ

When I look on the devastation caused by the wildfires in the Los Angeles area, I am moved with compassion but also humbled and intimidated by the power of the wind-driven fires.

As a *Laudato Si* parish, working to bring healing to the planet in the face of human caused climate change, we recognize the "perfect storm" at work in Los Angeles: climate change induced draught conditions, seasonal Santa Ana winds and overdevelopment leading to the vulnerability of different neighborhoods to these wildfires.

As compassionate Christians, we empathize with the devastating losses of lives, homes and treasured memories which the victims have suffered, and we will reach out to help them in their hour of need. We encourage you to donate to Catholic Charities LA. Our contributions will provide immediate and short-term relief for the victims. For the longer term and bigger picture, we must continue to raise awareness of the causes of climate change and take practical steps to mitigate climate change in our area and work for better policies to address the long-term issues of climate destruction.

Our reading from the letter to the Corinthians today reminds us that there are a variety of gifts but the same Spirit. So too, there are a variety of steps to be taken but the same goal: to bring healing to Mother Earth.



1st Quarter Stewardship News

"To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." (1 CORINTHIANS 12:7)

In today's second reading St. Paul tells us that God has blessed each of us for a reason. How has God blessed you? Are you using your gifts according to God's plan? How are you as a *Steward* helping to build God's kingdom here on earth? Take time to discern your charisms (gifts from the Holy Spirit). In *Stewardship*, God has given each of us different gifts. Let's be thankful for the gifts God has given us and generously share them with others. Perhaps at the start of this New Year you might resolve to find more ways to share your unique skills and talents so that your special strengths will make a difference in this world.

We want to thank all of you who have given so much of your time, talent, and treasure to support Xavier throughout last year. We are also grateful for your support during the Christmas season. Whether you gave your time to serve during the liturgies or share your musical talents or volunteer to decorate the church or share your financial blessings with the parish...or a little bit of everything, we want you to know it is greatly appreciated! Thank you. Our Christmas collection of \$83,610 exceeded our budget of \$75,000 and last year's total of \$73,866. We received \$3,564 for Christmas flowers compared to \$4,312 last year. Also, we received \$88,850 in end of year gifts compared to \$94,414 last year. It is only through your gifts can we make a difference in the lives of those we serve.

We are pleased to report that we finished the first quarter with an operating surplus of \$236,298 versus a budgeted surplus of \$95,317 and compared to a surplus of \$216,047 last year. During the quarter we also had \$36,223 in capital expenditures not included in our operating results. The favorable results are due primarily to higher interest income combined with lower repairs & maintenance, administrative, and music ministry program, and other program expenses.

As stated in our Annual Report we are budgeting a \$299,481 operating surplus this year. We are hopeful that a portion of the surplus can be used to replenish the reserves that were used to fund the capital expenditures in the last three fiscal years as well as funding additional capital expenditures necessary to maintain the church and school and to enrich the life of the parish. Our goal is to continue to ensure that our parish is in a sound financial position so that it may continue to flourish. We remain dependent on your generous support in the Sunday offertory, maintenance second collection and Christmas and Easter gifts to help ensure we cover our operating and capital expenditures so that we can replenish our reserves.



Our House is on Fire

How are we to react to the devastation in L.A.? Scientists have been warning us for over a decade that climate-induced disasters would increase as the planet's warming increases. On the one hand, we can be shocked by the devastation, and on the other, not surprised that it happened given the combination of climate-induced drought and the strong Santa Ana winds in an area covered with brush.

Economists have indicated that prevention and mitigation are less costly than disaster relief and rebuilding. And it would save lives and provide jobs if we address the causes of climate warming instead of its disastrous consequences. We need to dramatically step up our pressure on our legislators to address the cause of climate warming and make the transition off of fossil fuels happen with urgency. Short of dramatic action, we will be seeing many more climate-induced disasters. These are not "natural" disasters, but unnatural disasters.

The L.A. disaster follows smaller, similar disasters where entire towns were turned to ashes: Lahaina, Oahu, Hawaii in 2023; the Native American village of Lytton, B.C. in 2021 (one of the oldest continuously inhabited villages in North America); the small towns of Phoenix and Talent in Oregon in 2020; and the town of Paradise in northern California in 2018. This in addition to millions of acres of forests that have burned from wildfires. For the last ten years, the average area burned was the size of New Jersey and Delaware combined - EACH YEAR! Our house is burning.

Want to do something? First, donate to the LA Catholic Charities Fire Relief Fund, (see box in bulletin), and second, this is a moment to call your Congresspersons to say that we need legislation to stop climate warming....a bill that transitions us off of fossil fuels.
